

VILLA TACTICS AFTER DEFEAT ARE BAFFLING

(By Associated Press)
 SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 1.—Francisco Villa's army which advanced on Juarez with the intention of conquering northern Mexico and establishing a rebel government in the north, retired before United States troops fully demoralized and disorganized, was defeated, impressed soldiers who deserted and civilians who fled at Villa Ahumada.

After two days and nights of inter-tribal fighting for possession of Juarez Villa had depleted his army of fighting men. A member of his staff who came to the border after the retirement and many of Villa's men had no ammunition. Only Villa's headquarters had more than 100 rounds left. He had thrown their rifles away while crossing the desert with the American cavalry in pursuit.

Villa's telegrapher, who escaped from Villa at Villa Ahumada, reports that Villa's headquarters in Juarez that night were without food and that the people were very low.

SPRING VALLEY MINE SHIPPING

An initial shipment of ore from the Piedmont mines, in Spring Valley, 50 miles from Ely, Nevada, will be made next week on arrival of President Fred H. Vahrenkamp, under whose direction the property has been worked. The fifty tons will run between 275 and 300 ounces of silver, and a second car of the same grade will be forwarded next week. The Piedmont is one of the many properties being reopened after years of inactivity. An English company, operating from 1865 to 1874, is reported to have shipped to Swansea, via Sacramento, ore that contained 4,500,000 ounces of silver. Development is being prosecuted through two tunnels 1200 feet apart vertically. The estimated tonnage available is 100,000 tons of 300 ore. This excludes high-grade samples of which were recently shipped to this city. Associated with Vahrenkamp are Dr. Edward Bowes of Oakland, and H. G. W. Dinkelspiel of San Francisco.

LENINE TIRED OF RULING REDS

 STOCKHOLM, Aug. 1.—The Svenska Dabbladet says it is informed by persons closely connected with the Russian soviet government that Nicholas Lenine, premier, intends to begin a drastic change in the police and then retire. One condition of his retirement will be that War Minister Trotsky remain in command of the Red army, the newspaper said. It is reported that Lenine declared the best way to check the reaction, as represented by Admiral Kolchak, head of the All-Russian government, would be to drop power temporarily to prove that no other power is able to reorganize Russia.

POLTAVA WON BY LOYALISTS

 LONDON, Aug. 1.—General Denikin of the non-Bolshevik Russian army, has captured Poltava, with large supplies and much war material according to advices. This indicates a notable northward sweep of Denikin's forces. A Moscow dispatch says the Bolshevik forces have advanced fourteen miles on the Onga sector on the Archangel front. The story said a mutiny of the allied troops aided the advance.

The Moscow statement was dated Thursday. The rising reported appears to have been subsequent to a recent mutiny among Russian troops on the Archangel front, reported by British authorities.

A Moscow message reports unrest in Siberia. It is claimed there the insurgent front is extending from Tashkend, Turkestan to Nikolayevsk on the Amur. It was declared that insurgents annihilated a large detachment of Japanese recently in the Amur region. It is asserted that an advanced Bolshevik detachment is advancing toward Tomsk from northern Siberia.


BASES FOR THE PACIFIC FLEET

 SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 1.—San Francisco, Puget Sound and Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, will be the three chief bases for the Pacific fleet, according to naval officers here. The first two ports will hold most of the vessels that will be laid up with skeleton crews and the larger ships on active duty will chiefly center at Pearl Harbor, it is said.

San Pedro and San Diego will be base ports for many submarines, destroyers and chasers. More patrol vessels also will be available for Alaskan waters.

Just how the fleet will be divided among the waters of the Pacific was not known here and it was said division would not be decided until after the fleet had made its tour of coast ports and to Honolulu.

It has been intimated that a great training station for Southern California would be established at San Diego.
