WAR CAMP ROOMS OPEN IN RENO

RENO, Aug. 8.—Permanent headquarters for the Reno chapter of the American Legion have been opened over the old Palace Bar on Centre street and Commercial Row. Harry Z. Irwin has been appointed executive secretary with offices in the hall where he will take care of needy service men, secure them employment, attend to insurance and handle all the executive business of the organization.

Tonopah has set the example to Reno when it named its chapter Post Elmer Bell. Carson has adopted Capitol Post and Ely has selected Post Quentin Roosevelt. Charters have been received by these four posts. Carson was just organized last week and Verdi, with eighteen members promised, is also asking for a charter.

State Commander Scruggs has determined upon a more intensive campaign for new posts and expects to have every community in the state within the service organization before the summer months are over.

He has appointed state committees to organize new chapters and bring more members into the organization. It is estimated that there are 6000 ex-service men in the state who should belong to the American Legion.

At the meeting of the Reno Post last Monday night it was learned that General Pershing is expected to visit the Pacific coast in September, and if this turns out to be correct an effort will be made to have him stop off at Reno and deliver an address to the people of Nevada.
