

ALLIES ACCEPT THE ARCHDUKE

(Associated Press) GENEVA, Aug. 9.—A Vienna dispatch said the inter-allied mission at Budapest after a conference with Archduke Joseph and Premier Friedberg, forwarded to Premier Clemenceau, president of the peace conference, a report to the effect that the entente representatives are in full accord with the new Hungarian government.

(Associated Press) VIENNA, Aug. 9.—Advises say that a state of siege has been proclaimed in Budapest.

MONUMENTS OF STRANGE RACE

(Correspondence Associated Press) MEXICO CITY, July 18.—Archaeological investigations by a government commission to solve the mystery of who built the great pyramids at San Juan Tostibucan, 27 miles from Mexico City, have brought to light two great granite heads of the ancient Mexican god of the air, Quetzalcoatl. These heads are almost perfect specimens, bearing all the symbolic markings.

The long-disputed point as to who erected the pyramids is as yet unsolved. These huge mounds, one to the east and the other to the west, the former being 761 by 721 feet at the base and 216 feet high, are generally attributed to a tribe that preceded the Toltecs, probably dating from about the sixth century.

VILLA GENERAL GIVES SELF UP

(Correspondence Associated Press) MEXICO CITY, July 10.—Luis Gutierrez, former general in command of military operations in Chihuahua, has surrendered to the government commander at Villa Santiago, Nuevo Leon, and has been taken to Monterrey according to statements given out here by the war department and its press dispatches from Saltillo, Coahuila, received in December, 1917, which show that this has been carrying on a desultory warfare against the government in various northern states. Gutierrez, a former Villa general, who has been in Havana, has returned after securing amnesty.

VEILED THREATS AGAINST CHINA

(Correspondence Associated Press) TOKIO, July 5.—Premier Hara recently told a political party delegation that "Should the disturbances in China continue, Japan may be compelled to adopt suitable measures for the safeguarding of Japanese interests."

It was reported on July 25 that France, Great Britain, Italy, Japan and the United States made friendly representations to the Chinese government urging the settlement of the long-standing quarrel between North and South China and strongly advising against the resumption of armed hostilities.

BACKBONE OF SUMMER HEAT IS SHATTERED

According to the records of the U. S. weather observer at this station, August will not size up with the experiences of last July as the average for the month is 72 compared with 73 for the previous month which was greatly exceeded by the actual fact. The highest reading for August was 94 and July 96 and the lowest reading for August was 39. A study of the records shows that the maximum heat of the summer is experienced about the last week in July and the first week in August when it begins to subside until by the end of August the reading is usually around 68. In the matter of rainfall the average for August is .39 of an inch compared with .31 of an inch for July. The wind also abates recording an average of six miles compared with seven miles an hour in July.

FORGED CHECKS AND GOT AWAY

E. J. Franklin, until lately bookkeeper for the engineering firm of Liddell & Spencer, is wanted by the police who expect to learn of his arrest this evening at Carson City on the charge of forgery and fraud by which he raised about \$1200.

Franklin left here yesterday morning in a Dodge car owned by Mr. Liddell and was seen between Hawthorne and Mine by Jack Grant, chief of police, who was returning from a months vacation and did not know the traveler was a fugitive from justice. There was no mistaking the car as the front spring was broken and tied up for temporary use. The chief of police could not understand why the stranger was so reticent and anxious to escape from his company until he learned the truth on reaching Tonopah. Franklin left here at 4 a. m. and Grant met him at 10 a. m. A wire was sent from Hawthorne instructing the sheriff at Carson City to arrest the man on arriving there.

Franklin worked for Liddell & Spencer for four months coming here from Sacramento where he said he had been employed as bookkeeper at the gas plant. He is 6 feet tall and weighs about 180 pounds. He is married and his family is somewhere in the mountains of California near Colfax.

JAPANESE SWARMING INTO MEXICO NEAR BOUNDARY

(Correspondence Associated Press) MEXICO CITY, July 18.—Three thousand Japanese have arrived in lower California with the evident intention of settling there, say Mexican newspapers which add that it is believed many of these immigrant Japanese crossed the international boundary and made secret entrance into the United States.

BEWARE OF BOGUS REVENUE COLLECTORS

Internal revenue collectors in this state and other western states are issuing statements warning the public against persons posing as officials of the treasury department and collecting fees under a threat that unless the amount asked for is paid criminal prosecutions will follow. Part of the statements issued read as follows:

"This bureau is in receipt of a report from the collectors in the middle western states that a man giving the name of Edward Wallace is working in and around various cities representing himself as an internal revenue collector and fraudulently collecting special taxes from proprietors of pool rooms and others."
Wallace is described as about 32

years old, 5 feet 8 inches tall, light hair and complexion and dressed in a light gray suit with a white straw hat.—Journal.




