SOLDIERS CUT OUT RUSTLERS

NOGALES, Ariz., Aug. 13.—United States Infantry outposts at five mile intervals along the Mexican border in the Nogales sub-district have almost eliminated cattle stealing from the Mexican side, according to army officers here. Outposts are located on high points along the border equipped with machine guns and Browning rifles. Between these outposts negro infantrymen patrol the border. Mexican officials are co-operating with the American army of 1919, and have ordered all woodchopper camps to be removed five miles from the border to prevent their being used as a screen for smuggling and the Mexicans officials have also promised to return any American cattle found on the Mexican side.

AERIAL ROUTE TO AUSTRALIA

 SYDNEY, Australia, July 9.—Survey of the route of the first section of the projected aerial service between Sydney and London was recently completed. The section extends from Sydney to Darwin, which is on the north coast of Australia and relatively near the Malay archipelago. The service will be carried on by a Sydney company.

From Darwin the route will cross the sea to the island of Timor, proceed along the Malay archipelago to India and thence run to Bagdad or Port Said, probably the latter. From Port Said it will cross Europe to London. The survey of the second section of the route, from Darwin through Malaya to Delhi, is now going on.

It is expected that the first flight will be made within the next few months and it is planned to have the proposed passenger and commercial services in full operation in about two years. If the company succeeds London will be reached regularly from here in six and one-half

days. The Sydney-Darwin section is 2000 miles. But the survey party travelled about 4000 miles in order to select the most satisfactory landing places or relay stations.

When the flights are in full swing business between Sydney and London will be greatly facilitated from the fact that letters may be answered within two weeks of their despatch from here.

MOTORING IN VILLA LANDS

 EL PASO, Tex., Aug. 13.—Motoring through northern Mexico is no pleasure jaunt under present conditions, so American business men with large interests in Mexico declared upon their return here recently after being held up by Villa men, arrested through in 1911, and finally released by the Carranza government officials.

Starting from El Paso with another American in a roadster, the American was held up by Villa men near San Leon. They occupied by speeding their car and driving through the Villa lines. This occurred after Villa had been driven from Juarez by American troops but, the American said, the men encountered had been left behind to guard Villa's wounded and had not learned what had happened at Juarez.

Reaching Chihuahua City, the American said he was threatened by the Carranza officials because of a business transaction he had had with a Mexican who had made false representations to the officials. After hiding from the police and escaping twice, he was finally arrested at Santa Rosalia, placed in jail there and, upon his return to Chihuahua City, was again arrested. He was forced to deposit a heavy bond for his release pending a hearing of the charges against him. He said these were only trumped up against him since he had them investigated by a civil court and his claims upheld.

On his trip through the north, during which he was away more than a month and covered more than 2200 miles in his automobile, the American said he found conditions very chaotic. He said commanders of federal forces were making forced loans and seizing property.

GREAT BRITAIN MUST BE MISTRESS OF SEA

SYDNEY, Australia, July 9.—"It would be gross stupidity on the part of the British people to relinquish any sea power they possess," recently declared Arthur Naval Minister Poynton. "Should as Britain is with all the trade routes converging on one point—London—it is absolutely necessary that she should have sufficient ships in her fleet to keep those trade routes open."


