ARMY TRUCKS TO CARRY MAITS

John J. Burke, chief clerk of the railway mail service, arrived this morning from San Francisco on an official visit and is left speculating how long he will have to share the hospitality of the camp. When asked what his department proposed doing with reference to maintaining mail service, Mr. Burke replied: "There are plenty of army trucks which could be used and there are airplanes at March Field which could be had for long distance sustained flights. I do not know what will be done but it seems to me that this is the only way to alleviate the situation."

With reference to such isolated places as Tonopah he was not prepared to say what relief could be afforded, but he thought a relay truck system would be established in the event of the stoppage continuing.

TO CELEBRATE ADMISSION DAY

A statewide celebration, to welcome home all the Nevada men who have been in the army or navy, will be held on Admission Day, October 31, if plans made by a committee representing the War Camps Community Service, the Mothers' clubs of Reno, the Red Cross and the Commercial club are carried out.

Admission day in Nevada has never been generally observed, except to a slight extent in the schools, and this state has not held a general welcome home day for the men who were in the service, so it was decided, after some discussion, to proclaim Admission day as a welcome home day and to ask for its general observance.

It is planned to have all the returned service men in every community parade on that day and hold ceremonies.

was settled to the satisfaction of both sides which signed a contract for one year calling for a flat rate and abandonment of the sliding scale which had obtained in all copper camps. This applies to Butte, Anaconda and Great Falls which are controlled by the International Union of Mining, Mill and Smeltermen of the American Federation of Labor. At Jerome the mines had resumed. With reference to Oatman he could not speak as that camp is in the province of his associate.

The conference of operators and the newly organized union and Trades council yesterday afternoon resulted in the operators promising a reply in 24 hours to the proposition of the workers which reads as follows:

The agreement, made and entered into this, 26th day of August, 1919, by and between one thousand nine hundred and seventy-two miners, the operators of the Tonopah and Divide mining districts, the parties of the first part and the proposed Tonopah and Divide Mine and Mill Workers' union and the Tonopah Trades Assembly, the parties of the second part:

Witnesseth: That the said parties of the first part, in consideration of the covenants and agreements on the part of the said parties of the second part, heretofore contained, hereby covenant with the parties of the second part that the parties of the first part will pay in compensation for labor performed by said employees or parties of the second part on the following basis, two dollar flat increase of the established Tonopah scale existing before the present trouble commenced. Eight hours from collar to collar to constitute a shift's work in all mines.

It is further understood and agreed that there will be no discrimination against any men for participating in the present strike or in the affairs of said employees' union and that the right of said employees to organize such union for their own mutual protection and benefit will not be interfered with by any representative of or party of the first part.

The above mentioned union shall be known as the Tonopah and Divide Mine and Mill Workers' union and together with the Tonopah Trades Assembly shall be recognized as the properly constituted bodies for said employees to deal with in all matters pertaining to this agreement.

And the said parties of the second part in consideration of the said covenants on the part of said parties of the first part heretofore contained agree to and with the said parties of the first part

TONOPAH GOES ON FOOD LIMIT

As soon as the news of the tie-up at Oakland was received here merchants placed their customers on a rationing list with the object of conserving supplies for as long a time as possible. The first check was placed on fresh commodities and no more than a dozen eggs, one pound of butter, or one pound of sugar was permitted to go out to a single customer. Stocks are normal and are sufficient to last for any reasonable length of time but it was deemed a more prudent plan to begin right away and thereby prevent hoarders from getting in their deadly work.

One car load of fresh vegetables arrived today at Mina and will be brought in tomorrow when the last carload of ice also will be received. As a possible source of relief the Bishop country is mentioned and it is believed that in the event of the transportation lines being blocked for more than a week that truck lines will be opened into Inyo county. The only drawback is the supply of gasoline of which there is only a slender reserve stock.

The said parties of the second part will agree that any grievance arising between both parties of this agreement that no strike or lockout will be instituted except as a last resort or after all honorable means have been tried and failed to adjust such grievance.

It is further agreed that the Nevada state law pertaining to not less than two men working in any place will be adhered to by all parties concerned.

It is further agreed that any violation of any part of this agreement by either party may serve to render this agreement null and void.
