MISSIONARY AUTOMOBILE GOES INTO THE TRUCKEE

The means of travel of a missionary band that has been holding meetings around Reno for two weeks was put out of commission and two members of the band were injured, when a small car driven by Stanley Bizard plunged headlong off the bridge leading from Riverside drive to Belle Isle landed on its side in the river.

Bizard escaped with a few scratches while his companions, Bert Yeager and Mrs. C. Stimier, suffered greater injuries. Yeager's left leg was broken at the ankle and Mrs. Stimier was badly bruised about the body but received no broken bones. Yeager was taken to the county hospital.

It was Bizard's third attempt to drive an automobile and when the car started over the rough approach to the rocky old bridge, he lost control of it and it went over the side taking about twenty feet of the iron railing of the bridge with it.

"NEW" LONDON BRIDGE

The new London bridge was opened on August 1, 1918. It replaced the celebrated old bridge, built more than eight centuries before. It had eighteen solid piers with bulky stone arches and was covered from end to end with buildings. On the "Traitors gate," at one end, the heads of traitors were shown. It was removed on account of its obstruction to navigation.
