LOS ANGELES, Nov. 8.—The Monterey Oil company, having successfully passed the California corporation commission, will offer a limited amount of stock for sale in Reno, Minden, Mina and Tonopah, the homes of the men that advanced the money necessary to promote this great enterprise. Out of 750,000 shares of treasury stock, 100,000 will be placed in Tonopah, 100,000 in Reno and a like amount in Minden Carson and Mina. This stock will be sold to the purchaser for 25 cents per share, and before purchasing I would ask the purchaser to look over the permit given us by the commission, which provides that none but the treasury stock shall be sold, the balance promotion, or personal stock, shall be held in trust by a trustee that will be appointed by the commission until such time as we strike oil or the commission is satisfied that we are about to develop a well. MINA MERCURY SHIPPING QUICK

Work on the Consolidated West Extension Simon Mines company is being pushed vigorously, the crosscut from the 119-foot level being in 162 feet from the shaft. In prospecting on the surface the other day a ledge was uncovered at a point about 200 feet in a westerly direction from the shaft which, when sampled and assayed, gave every indication of being a genuine find of great importance as it indicates the presence of an orebody the existence of which was totally unsuspected.

What is believed to be the largest shipment of quicksilver ever sent from Nevada camp went out from Mina on Southern Pacific train No. 23, last night. It consisted of eighty-seven flasks from the Whaley-Bedford lease, and twelve flasks from the Drew-Bug property, both in the Foot Mountain (Gardner) district, some twelve miles east of Mina. The total value of the shipment at the present price of quicksilver is about \$7,400.

The Simon Silver Consolidated Mining company, recently incorporated by a group of Reno mining men has acquired, in addition to its claim near the Simon Silver Lead mine, a group of six claims in the Gardiner district, just west of Mina, and proposes to start an active development campaign at once.
