

CAVE-DWELLERS IN RUSSIA LOOK FOR HARD WINTER

(Correspondence of Associated Press) OMSK, Sept. 20, via Vladivostok, Oct. 8.—Several thousand cave-dwellers in the outskirts of Omsk, facing a Siberian winter only a month or two off, living in a hand-to-mouth fashion with nothing in the way of clothing but rags in which they shiver, constitute a problem for the American Red Cross, practically the only organization to which they can look with any hope of relief.

The Associated Press correspondent accompanied Major Charles McDonald and Dr. F. F. Johnson, Red Cross managers, on a tour of inspection today. They were trying to gauge the necessities and match them against their resources already badly strained with relief work among refugees and troops.

MAY TAKE BOSNIA MANY YEARS TO STAGE COME BACK

(Correspondence Associated Press) SARAJEVO, Bosnia, Oct. 6.—Bosnia may be a long time recovering from the effects of the war. Factory production is almost at a standstill, railroad transport is irregular and uncertain, stores are bare, stocks, markets are much reduced, clothing and food are high in price, and there is much illness among the people. The crops this year, however, are abundant and there is stored food to meet all needs.

BRITISH BELIEVE RUSS BOLSHIEV ARE NEARLY DONE

(Correspondence of Associated Press) LONDON, Oct. 15.—British military experts believe the Russian bolshevik cannot withstand the onslaughts of their enemies longer than two months and that something definite is likely to happen in the Russian campaign by December 1.


ADMIRAL KOLCHAK PARTICIPATES IN THANKSGIVING SERVICE
