

SWEDEN HAS A WAR REACTION

(Correspondence Associated Press) STOCKHOLM, Dec. 2.—Reaction after the war-time boom, strikes, the high cost of living, increased taxation and lack of capital, have com-

lined to cause a general depression in the Swedish financial market. Several large financial and commercial concerns have recently failed, drawing down with them affiliated firms. COMPENSATION FOR TEACHERS

(Correspondence of Associated Press) LOS ANGELES, Cal., Dec. 29.—Emphasizing the need of teachers for increased compensation, Dr. W. W. Wood, 3, Proctor of Reed college, Portland, Ore., and delegate to the California State Teachers' convention here today that it would be a mistake for teachers to organize demands affiliated with the American Federation of Labor.

Let us not be too hard on school teachers, superintendents and college professors who will the work of the day have not maintained the minimum of their teaching staffs. Teachers should demand a "dividend" when they are responsible to the people, and the price of a "dividend" is the possession of confidence and possession would make necessary greater in getting with the American Federation of Labor and other primary unions. WILL ENCOURAGE HOME BUILDING

(Correspondence of Associated Press) LONDON, Dec. 4.—The British government proposes to subsidize the erection of necessary homes for the people and to prevent the building of what are characterized as "luxury houses." The plan has been proposed to the house of commons by Dr. Christopher Addison, minister of health. Dr. Addison proposed that a subsidy of \$150 should be offered for each house built within a specified time. Austin Chamberlain, chairman of the exchequer, announced that the treasury had agreed to lend to local authorities of small communities money for building purposes, but that the authorities of larger communities would have to supply their own resources. Two difficulties, he said, confronted the government, that of obtaining money and labor and he advised that public opinion be aroused to obtain both.

WIDOW OF LOCATOR OF SAVAGE MINE IS DEAD
Mrs. Sarah Savage, a resident of Nevada, who was the widow of the discoverer of the Savage mine in Virginia City, died Friday morning at Reno, at the age of eighty-seven years. Mrs. Savage came across the plains and settled at a Nevada city in 1867.

"It is only the fact that the government is the holder and only seller of this meat that keeps it at its present exorbitant price," declared the society.

OREGON HENS MAKE WORLD RECORD

CORVALLIS, Ore., Dec. 29.—A dozen hens at the Oregon Agricultural college's farm at Salem, Ore., have set a new world record for egg production. James S. Dryden, professor at the college, has announced. Each of these hens in one year laid more than 300 eggs, the best producing 330 and two others 323. All these hens, according to Professor Dryden, are of the strain that several years ago developed Lady Nuff, the first hen to have laid more than 300 eggs a year in a trap nest. Her record was 302.


