GOLD PLACERS LOST TO U. S. BY A SURVEY

KETCHIKAN, Alaska, Jan. 14.—Valuable gold deposits near Hyder, south of Ketchikan, which are reported to be miles in extent, have been lost to the United States by the decision of the American surveyors defining the boundary line between Alaska and Canada. It was decided to follow the lines of Canadian surveys rather than the monuments of early Russian lines.

Articles near Hyder reports of which spread to the outside world, have elicited hundreds of inquiries from the United States and even Great Britain, which, it is believed, may press a "rush" to Hyder next spring rivaling the famous Klondike stampede. The American engineers on the official boundary survey, agreed with the Canadian party to leave the lines of the Russian survey and instead of following a natural ridge up to the head waters of Salmon river, turned west at an angle of 45 degrees, throwing into Canada the upper Salmon river district and the hills where are located the majority of the Hyder deposits.

According to reports received here, the mines, while said to be remarkably rich in ore, are difficult of access and considerable development work is necessary before they can be put on a paying basis. At the Premier mine, now said to be controlled by New York interests, thousands of dollars have been spent in building roads, and thousands more in development of the mine itself. For miles on both the American and Canadian sides, every claim has been staked and there is little ground left open in the district, it is reported.

NO LOSS OF REVENUE.

By Associated Press. LOUISVILLE, Ky., Jan. 14.—Loss of revenue from whiskey, beer and wines will not decrease the revenue of Kentucky for 1920, according to the state tax commission. The commission's annual report stated that normal increase in property values and in growing industries will offset the loss in taxes on liquor.

COAL FIELDS OF SPITSBERGEN

Correspondence of Associated Press. CHRISTIANIA, Dec. 27.—Coal fields are the most valuable assets of Spitzbergen for which the supreme council at Paris has given Norway sovereignty. It is estimated here that if these fields are developed they will provide coal enough to supply northern Norway and the northern district of Russia. Spitzbergen coal is said to be the best grade of hard coal. Mining for ore at present is not much beyond the experimental stage in Spitzbergen. The fishing about the islands is very poor.
