**ADDRESS ON THE LIFE OF LINCOLN**

At a general assembly of seventh and eighth grades and high school students Monday afternoon, an address was made by Mr. Smith Stimmel, G. A. The central theme of the address was the pure Americanism of Lincoln, which Mr. Stimmel pointed out, was based upon the fundamental principles of character development, truth, honesty and industry.

Mr. Stimmel's vigorous English and droll touches of humor make of him a pleasing speaker, and the young people were enthusiastic listeners every moment of the time given them.

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**KIDDIES GIVEN A REAL TREAT**

**NEW YORK, March 10.**—The gift of the children of America to the children of Belgium, the first juvenile reading room in Europe, will be opened in Brussels about the first of May, it has been announced here by the book committee of the art war relief. The committee conducted the campaign for funds with which to establish the reading room, which is the first of a series to be opened in France and Belgium.

These reading rooms will be called "L'Heure Joyeuse"—Joyous Hour—and will be replicas of the pleasant children's reading rooms in American libraries. The book committee is supplying books and library furniture. The first shipment of books has already arrived in Brussels. E. Jacquin, Belgian minister of education, wrote:

"Belgian children have no opportunity to read at all, except such books as might exist in their homes. There is neither free nor paying libraries for them. Not only children, but teachers, parents and public officials will catch that new world spirit that free, broad democratic sense, that respect for the child as a future citizen, which everyone coming to America cannot fail to admire."

**IMPORTANT NOTICE**

To Secretaries of Corporations Doing Business in Nevada But Incorporated in Other States  
**NOT TOO LATE TO SAVE \$100 PER MONTH**

**SECTION 1.**—All foreign corporations doing business in the State of Nevada shall, not later than the month of March in each year, beginning in the year 1914, publish a statement of their last year's business in some newspaper published in the State of Nevada. If published in a daily newspaper, such statement shall be published for a period of one week, or if published in a semi-weekly or tri-weekly newspaper, for a period of two weeks; or if published in a weekly newspaper for a period of four weeks.

**SECTION 2.**—The secretary of the company publishing the statement shall file a copy with the assessor of each county of the State of Nevada, in which said company is doing business.

**SECTION 4.**—Any district attorney in the state is competent to sue to recover the penalty, or the attorney general. The first county suing through its district attorney shall secure the penalty, and if no suit is brought for the penalty by any district attorney the State shall have the right to recover through its attorney-general.
