#### RATIFICATION FAILS BY VOTE OF 49 TO 35

 WASHINGTON, March 20.—The treaty of Versailles was returned to President Wilson today by the senate after it failed to ratify it last night for the fourth time. There is no indication as to what President Wilson would do with the treaty. White House officials said the usual procedure would be to send it to the state department for "burial" in the archives there. Ratification was defeated last night by a vote of 49 to 35.

#### World's Most Powerful Battleship Is Launched

#### SURRENDER OF REBEL TROOPS

 OPENHAGEN, March 20.—The troops of von Luetwitz, forces which were being housed in the castle at Schleswig, surrendered unconditionally and power is again in the hands of the old government, according to the Nachrichten of Hamburg.

#### ESSEN IN HANDS OF SPARTACANS

 BRUSSELS, March 20.—The capture of Essen was effected Friday by a Spartacan army of about 100,000 men and an equipment of armored automobiles according to Aiz to (Chapel) address. The Spartacans proclaimed a soviet republic.

#### ALLIES ADVANCE GERMAN LINES

 LONDON, March 20.—There are many indications, according to a dispatch from Cologne today, that the allies are preparing to advance their concentrations of troops at Strassbourg and Metz further into Germany if the country does not quiet soon.

#### COBLENZ SENDS OUT SPECIAL RELIEF

 COBLENZ, March 20.—A special train made up at the direction of American army officers, left Coblenz today for Leipzig to bring back 200 Americans and allied business men who are stranded and reported in danger.

#### Newberry Found Guilty of Criminal Conspiracy

 GRAND RAPIDS, Mich., March 20.—Senator Truman H. Newberry was found guilty of criminal conspiracy in the campaign of 1918, according to a verdict returned in the United States district court here today. The case has been on trial eight weeks (starting with 123 active defendants and including with 85. Sixteen defendants besides Newberry were found guilty. All others were found not guilty.

#### DEMPSEY AND KEARNS PLEAD

 SAN FRANCISCO, March 20.—Jack Dempsey world's heavyweight champion and his manager, Jack Kearns, pleaded not guilty today before Judge Robert Beaman of the United States district court, when arraigned on charges of conspiracy to evade the selective draft act. Dempsey furnished a bond of \$2,000 and Kearns \$1,000.

#### NOSKE WILL STAY IN OFFICE

 PARIS, March 20.—Gustav Noske, who tendered his resignation as minister of defense to President Ebert of Germany yesterday, has decided to remain in office as a social democrat and the democratic members of the national assembly having given him a vote of confidence.

#### HITCHCOCK MADE TARGET FOR DRIES

#### 2000 PERSONS SLAIN TO DATE

 LONDON, March 20.—Two thousand persons have been killed to date in the fighting incident to the German revolutionary movement and disturbances of the past week, it is estimated in Berlin, according to the Exchange Telegraph.

#### GERMAN STRIKERS BACK TO WORK

 LONDON, March 20.—The general strike in Germany has been called off according to Berlin address. The government is said to have accepted the workers' demands, including far-reaching concessions to independent societies.

## STUPENDOUS PROJECT TO EXPLORE SOUTH OF MOUNT BROUGHER
