(By Associated Press) NEW BERNE, N. C., May 17.—Named in memory of Major Archibald W. Butt, the young Georgian army officer who was aide to President Roosevelt and Taft and who lost his life in the Titanic disaster, the concrete passenger-carrying steamer Major Archibald Butt is being put in shape for service in the transportation division of the war department. The vessel was launched recently at the Newport Shipbuilding Corporation's plant here and was christened with champagne by Mrs. T. F. Hines, wife of Brigadier-General Hines.

NO CARGOES IN THE PHILIPPINES

(Correspondence Associated Press) MANILA, P. I., April 24.—Cargo ships are leaving Manila frequently with their holds practically empty, shipping agents say, because of adverse market conditions in the United States. The low price for hemp and coconut oil, two of the leading articles of export from the Philippines, is one of the principal factors in causing the surplus of cargo space, shippers assert.

Because of the large stocks of these products accumulated during the war, both here and in the United States, a surplus has been created and it is said they may now be purchased at a lower price in the United States than in the Philippines.
