INDUSTRIAL REGENERATION.

Forty years ago Tybo was the center of activity in Southern Nevada. The name was the synonym for the great successful mining center. Half a score of furnaces belched their fires to the heavens illuminating the mountain wastes. Pillars of fire by night and clouds of smoke by day served to guide the feet of investors and prospectors to that district where the nerves of capital pulsed and throbbled with incessant endeavor. The hillsides were dotted with cabins of woodcutters whose charcoal ovens furnished employment for scores of hardy pioneers in a region that was remotely related to the busy centers of commerce and manufacture. Mining in its most advanced stage was prosecuted and smelting in the crude form of these early days was conducted with the diligence that Tybo had been the most prosperous camp in the state. Several thousand people found a means of livelihood through these activities and prospectors came and went from the smelting center in quest of other deposits of precious metals. Operations of the wood-burners widened the area of operations until it at last became apparent that smelting could no longer be carried on at a profit. The palsy of the single standard combined with the rivalry of other mines more favorably situated for transportation completed the ruin that had been hanging over the camp ever since the stores of fuel wrested from the densely wooded mountains began to thin out. It was a simple economic problem that eventuated in virtual abandonment of the camp and its relapse into a wilderness where first principles asserted themselves and the wild denizens of plains and hills gradually crept back in the retreating train of modern business life. The mines remained with their storehouses of untold wealth submerged in the seepage from the hills. The pictures of desolation were completed when the glowing furnaces subsided and the masonry began to crumble.

Tybo became a vestige of its former greatness. The name alone survived to remind others of the rich deposits whose wealth remained drowned in tenantless workings far below the surface. Generations came and went without exciting the cupidity of capital until one day the state was startled by the news that a master mind had entered the deserted arena in an effort to reclaim the abandoned treasure. The opportunity was there but it required invincible faith and almost limitless capital to crystallize the dreams of the intrepid adventurer. The enterprise was of the superlative order demanding the highest order of engineering genius to bring about a consummation of the exploit. Obstacles of overpowering magnitude confronted the engineers who struggled valiantly with the problem with an obstinate conviction that they would win their own reward. Five years have elapsed since the first effort was put forth to rescue Tybo from an untimely grave. These years were filled with distressing experiences disheartening failures and cold criticism from an unresponsive public. The tonnage was there, the values spoke for themselves but many questions of economic application remained unsolved in the crucible of experience. This might be termed the first stage of the revival which was qualified by stubborn facts that impeded more rapid progress to the goal of ambition. Then came the men of today, the men whose magic hand has wrought wonders in the old mining camp bringing order and prosperity out of chaos and experimentation. Tybo once more resounds with the hum of hoists, the drone of blast furnaces, the thunder of dropping stamps all actuated by the invisible energy brought hundreds of miles from the far off Sierras to give the finishing touch to an investment salvaged from the pioneer days by the man whose dominating initiative brought out of Siberia the precious platinum that was essential for Uncle Sam to win the war against Germany. F. W. Draper, the modest engineer, of the Siberian adventure is the hero whose talents are responsible for rescuing Tybo from the bats, owls, and coyotes and restoring it to its eminence on the map of Nevada as a great producer of mineral wealth. Tybo was a metropolis when Tonopah was in the womb of Nature and Tonopah today extends the glad hand of camaraderie to the giant just awakening from a long slumber to lend his strength to the upbuilding of Nevada as a producer of precious and industrial metals.
