RESOLUTE BEATS SHAMROCK IN FINAL CUP RACE

MASSACHUSETTS GOVERNOR NOTIFIED OF VICE PRESIDENTIAL NOMINATION

COOLIDGE VOICES COUNTRY'S NEEDS AT NOTIFICATION

Republican Vice Presidential Nominee Formally Accepts Honor Bestowed On Him. GREAT CROWD AT CEREMONY Northampton, College Town, Decorated For Occasion; Party Leaders There

Northampton, Mass., July 27.—Governor Calvin Coolidge was formally notified today of his nomination as the republican candidate for vice president in exercises which opened with a meeting of the notification committee and an informal luncheon for committeemen at the Coolidge home at noon, and concluded with the ceremonies of notification at 2 o'clock on Allen field at Smith college. The little college city was decorated with the national colors and pictures of the governor were everywhere displayed. The city was crowded with visitors.

NATURAL DEATH IS VERDICT OF JURY

A coroner's jury late yesterday afternoon returned a verdict of death from natural causes in the case of James G. Mateer, employee of the Tonopah Steam Laundry, who was found dead in his house in the rear of 206 Depot Saturday night. The body of Mateer was found by Lawrence Christensen, manager of the laundry, who stated that Mateer had asked for a leave of absence two weeks before, stating that he wanted to go to his relatives. The body when found was in a bad state of decomposition, and the man had apparently been dead about two weeks. He had been a resident of Tonopah since 1905. The remains were interred immediately after the discovery Saturday night. The coroner's jury yesterday consisted of Eugene O'Connell, Thomas Grady, Andrew Leika, J. L. Mohan, Walter Fuller and J. H. Burns. The inquest was held before Justice of the Peace Grier.

NEW THEORY IN TRUNK MURDER

Search for Second Trunk Believed to contain Vital Organs of Body. DETROIT, July 27.—A statement to the police by Mrs. Leo Tramball, wife of a patrolman, that Mrs. Eugene Leroy, victim in Detroit's trunk murder mystery, had confided to her she was about to become a mother, injected a new theory in the case today. The police today are divided in their attention between the hunt for Leroy, husband of the slain woman, and a second trunk believed to contain the vital organs of the body, and which is known to have been sent from the apartment house where the Leroy's lived.

TO CONFER ON SOVIET OFFER

Millerand and Foch Leave For Boulogne to Meet Premier; To Discuss Proposal. PARIS, July 27.—Premier Millerand, accompanied by Marshal Foch, left today for Boulogne, where he will discuss with Premier Lloyd George the Russian Soviet proposal for a conference with the allies. It is reported Millerand was sounded by the British government on the question and gave a preliminary indication of entering into negotiations with the Russians, the acknowledgment by the Soviet of international engagements of the former Russian governments and confirmation by the Russian people of the Soviet's authority.
