**FRENCH ATTACK
SECRET BETTING**

Proposed Law Would Establish
Free Wagering Offices in
all Large Cities

(Correspondence of Associated Press)
PARIS, Aug. 25.—Clandestine betting would be suppressed in France under bills just introduced in the chamber of deputies by Baron Maurice de Rothschild and Leo Bouyssou. Deputy Bouyssou proposes that illegal betting be suppressed by the creation of a state organization of control, and the imposition of a tax at race tracks and other places. A tax of 6 per cent on the estimated 10,000,000 francs illegally bet daily would bring the French government a revenue of 600,000 francs daily, or for the 320 racing days, an annual revenue from this source of 200,000,000 francs. To this would be added 40,000,000 or 50,000,000 francs from a tax on book betting which would be re-established and allowed in a special enclosure under the Bouyssou measure. This bill also proposes the creation of free betting offices in Paris and all cities of more than 100,000 inhabitants.

**BANDITS THICK
NEAR BOSPHORUS**

Lives of Americans Endangered
by Warfare Between Turks
and Allied Troops

CONSTANTINOPLE, Aug. 1.—Many Americans have had narrow escapes in the fighting which British and Greek troops have kept up for several weeks with the bandits who are harassing the eastern shore of the Bosphorus. Beikos, a summer place 10 miles north of this city, reached by hourly ferry service, has been the chief center of the fights between bands of adherents of Mustafa Kemal Pasha, nationalist leader, and the British-Greek soldiers operating under the artillery protection of British warships. An American oil company is erecting two great steel tanks at Beikos which came well within the line of fire between the rival forces. The steel-riveters were compelled to flee for their lives. Robert college and Constantinople college for women, the two American institutions of higher learning on the Bosphorus, both commanded an excellent view of the struggle and were safely out of range of the national list bullets.

**CREW OF SHIP
ARE CASTAWAY**

Australians Live for Months on
Convict Island Before Being
Rescued

SYDNEY, Australia, July 21.—Four weeks' experience on the Galapagos islands was sufficient for the crew of the Australian government liner Carawa, who, like the original Robinson Crusoe, were castaways on that island group last April. The Carawa last March left Port Arthur, Texas, for Australia with benzine and case oil. When in the Pacific it encountered a launch containing six men, who had been blown out to sea. The liner towed the launch to Chatham island in the Galapagos group. On Chatham island the Carawa struck a reef. Her stern post and rudder were torn away and she began to leak badly. The crew made for the shore and watched their boat sink. The men lived in a tent made from canvas from the ship and subsisted on canned meat and potatoes. The food supply was limited and sleep was out of the question on account of the mosquitoes. In addition, convicts on the island stole the castaways' belongings. A schooner carrying cattle and bags picked the men up and, after a voyage of 15 days, landed them at Guayaquil. Here they shipped on a steamer for Colon, where the Australian government liner Australange, bound to Sydney, picked them up early in July.
