HUNGARY TO REWARD WARTIME HEROES

(Correspondence of Associated Press) BUDAPEST, Sept. 2.—Hungary and battle achievements are to be rewarded with land grants in Hungary. A government decree authorizes Admiral Horthy, as regent of the Government, to bestow small tracts of land upon those distinguishing themselves in war or in the fight against bolshevism. The title of the land will descend to the eldest son.

Those honored by such grants will acquire also the right to prefix the title "Gallant" to their names and will be entitled to certain other privileges.

Several municipalities already have offered land for such purposes.

WYOMING PLANS LARGE PROJECT

(Associated Press) SALT LAKE CITY, Sept. 28.—There are many thousands of acres of land in western Wyoming susceptible of irrigation to the waters of the Green River and a project of this kind is being considered by the state of Wyoming, according to Ralph G. Woolley, engineer of the water resources branch of the United States geological survey who returned to Salt Lake recently from a recent reconnaissance survey of the Green river watershed. Mr. Woolley traveled a large part of the river in western Wyoming for the primary purpose of ascertaining its waterpower possibilities and the secondary purpose of studying the irrigation possibilities. Eventually the Green river region of Wyoming will become the seat of one of the great reclamation projects of the west according to Mr. Woolley. It is the purpose of Wyoming to utilize the waters of the Green river which is possible by first permitting them to flow into Utah, he said.

TONOPAHANS GET \$27,000 INSURANCE

Life insurance beneficiaries in Nevada received a total of \$282,000 in 1919, according to data compiled by the Insurance Commissioner of Nevada. Residents of Nevada received the largest sum, \$27,000 being received here for the year. Payments were made to relatives or friends of the insured persons.

Payments made in Elko totaled \$50,000 for the year. In Virginia City \$32,000; Carson City \$25,000; Tonopah \$27,000; Mesquite Springs \$20,000; Gardnerville \$14,000 and Esmeralda \$10,000.

The largest single payments on policies were \$30,000 to Elko on the policy held in the name of Fred W. Noble, and \$10,000 at Gardnerville on the policy held in the name of Peter Borda.—Gazette.
