

BIG METEOR FALLS TO GROUND IN W. VA.

MORGANTOWN, W. Va., Dec. 15.—Resident in the vicinity of Kingwood, Preston county, West Virginia, were thrown into a panic when a large meteor fell at Howesville, five miles south of Kingwood, according to reports received here. The meteor struck in the business section of Howesville and exploded as it buried itself in the earth. The blast was heard for several miles. An automobile near the railroad station was damaged by the explosion and the occupants of the machine were dazed, but escaped injury.

CHIPPewa FALLS, Wis., Dec. 15.—Louis Krueger, for two years sought as a draft evader, has been arrested.

H. A. Darms, president of the Darms Coal company, who is operating near Coaldale, was in Tonopah today getting supplies for the camp. Mr. Darms stated that the shaft had been under water and the diamond drill had been placed in the bottom ready for drilling. The driller is en route from the coast and should reach Coaldale tomorrow.

It is expected that the large vein of coal will be drilled through be-

fore 100 feet of exploration work has been completed. When the new shaft was sunk coal of excellent grade was encountered close to the surface, but in the old shaft a larger vein was uncovered at greater depth. It was upon this find that the new shaft was sunk, and expert coal operators who have inspected the property state that when the proper depth is reached in the new shaft an extra grade of coal should be encountered.
