

NYE COUNTY GRAND JURY ANSWERS THE CHARGE

Appropos of the late grand jury's report, and the exceptions taken to two paragraphs in said report by the retiring Nye county commissioners as published in Saturday morning's paper, the undersigned, with a determination not to enter into further public controversy, desiring to submit the following statement:

It was not the purpose of the grand jury to place the responsibility for the condition of roads in certain localities in outside country districts that has existed through a period of years, nor has it expected or contemplated that the commissioners could in the short time of their continued tenure, with a deficit of approximately \$40,000, accomplish the desired results. The object in view, and the results desired by the grand jury, was a better road condition and a better rural postal service for the future, thereby giving the farmers and stockraisers a better opportunity for the development of their industries.

Turning on the spotlight, inviting discussion and calling for co-operation for improved conditions is not casting reflections on officials or the county, nor has it the effect of diverting travel, as is the erroneous idea of some who would "cover" deficits, but on the contrary, it is notice to the world that the people of Nye county are "on the job" to not only maintain the good roads already made, but to improve the bad ones. Camouflage is but a temporary shield, and is not conducive to progress.

What Nevada wants is the settlement and reclamation of her land and the development of ALL her resources, the most powerful medium through which this can be accomplished being GOOD ROADS and GOOD RURAL POSTAL SERVICE, and the grand jury in its presentation and appeal did not take into consideration personalities, nor contemplate the wounding of anybody's feelings. Far be it from the undersigned to pluck one leaf from the laurels won or claimed, or withhold one jot of credit for earnest efforts made. I submit, however, without prejudice, that the expenditure of \$3 per capita does not signify that great road improvement has been accomplished; the large expenditure of money on state highways, for the past two years, has not afforded much relief to the inhabitants of Nye county. I believe that ways and means may be found through legislation, to divert some of the money in the highway fund to the improvement of some of the impassable crossroads of our county.

Sustaining our grand jury report, I am willing to lead either the old or the new county commissioners to at least three roads in three different parts of the county that have places from three to 10 miles long that are "passable only on hands and knees," figuratively speaking; also to the danger curves on Current Creek, near Current school. As to the paragraph complained of, containing the sentence, wherein it is said, "Scant notice is given by state and county officials," the old outside settler goes further and says, "Only round about election time," and this applies to all.

IMPORTANT NOTICE

To Secretaries of Corporations Doing Business in Nevada But Incorporated in Other States

OUR CHARGE \$7.50

SECTION 1.—All foreign corporations doing business in the State of Nevada shall, not later than the month of March in each year, beginning in the year 1914, publish a statement of their last year's business in some newspaper published in the State of Nevada. If published in a daily newspaper, such statement shall be published for a period of one week, or if published in a semi-weekly or tri-weekly newspaper, for a period of two weeks; or if published in a weekly newspaper for a period of four weeks.

SECTION 2.—The secretary of the company publishing the statement shall file a copy with the assessor of each county of the State of Nevada, in which said company is doing business.

SECTION 3.—Any district attorney in the state is competent to sue to recover the penalty, or the attorney general. The first county suing through its district attorney shall secure the penalty, and if no suit is brought for the penalty by any district attorney the State shall have the right to recover through its attorney general.

The TONOPAH DAILY BONANZA will make publication required by law, which includes the filing of a sworn affidavit of publication with the assessor of each of the counties of the State, within which the company is doing business; an affidavit of publication will also be furnished secretaries.
