PREPARING SCHEME FOR AN AERIAL DEFENSE

(Correspondence of Associated Press)
TOKIO, Nov. 22.—The navy department has prepared a scheme for aerial defense according to which by March next the Yokosuka naval port will have 52 seaplanes, 11 balloons, 11 airplanes and 22 training airplanes. Forty seaplanes will be based at Mitsu, 52 at Sasebo and 100 at Matsura.
Arrangements are also being made to carry one or two airplanes on each warship attached to the battle fleet. National airplane workshops are being established near Hiroshima and large training airfields will be located at Lake Kasumigaura, a large inland lagoon about 30 miles from Tokio. Training will commence here when the English naval instructors from England arrive in the spring.

REDUCTION OPPOSITION OF THE DUTCH ARMY

(By Associated Press)
AMSTERDAM, Jan. 4.—Opposition to the reduction of the Dutch army has revived here because of fears that a Belgian invasion may result from failure of the two governments to reach an agreement in the long-standing boundary dispute under the treaty of 1839.
At a recent meeting of the society, "Our Army," which includes most of the Dutch officers, men high in command of the Holland forces spoke strongly against a reduction of the army. One of them, Staff Captain Van Gensau, declared that a diminished army could not resist a Belgian invasion three months.

WEATHER OFFICIAL IN MONTHLY REPORT

The monthly meteorological summary issued by J. C. Piercy, Sr., observer of the local weather bureau, was received yesterday, and is in part as follows:
Average mean temperature, 30.11; highest, 50; lowest 13. Total precipitation for the month was 16; snowfall 3.2. Greatest precipitation was on the 11th, which amounted to 10. Total rainfall to date, 1.02; normal to date, 3.05. The prevailing direction of wind was southeast, total movement 5119 miles; average hourly velocity, 10.7; maximum velocity for five minutes was 48 miles per hour from the west on December 11. Number of days calm, 11; partly cloudy, 11; cloudy, 9; days on which more than .01 inch precipitation occurred, 5.

OUR CHARGE \$7.50

SECTION 1.—All foreign corporations doing business in the State of Nevada shall, not later than the month of March in each year, beginning in the year 1914, publish a statement of their last year's business in some newspaper published in the State of Nevada. If published in a daily newspaper, such statement shall be published for a period of one week, or if published in a semi-weekly or tri-weekly newspaper, for a period of two weeks; or if published in a weekly newspaper for a period of four weeks.
SECTION 2.—The secretary of the company publishing the statement shall file a copy with the assessor of each county of the State of Nevada, in which said company is doing business.
SECTION 3.—Any district attorney in the state is competent to sue to recover the penalty, or the attorney general. The first county suing through its district attorney shall secure the penalty, and if no suit is brought for the penalty by any district the State shall have the right to recover through its attorney general.
