

Frocks Interpret Childhood



SO CLOSE as the styles in little girls' frocks interpret little girlhood, it will not be necessary for them to cast about for anything startlingly new—no matter how simple they are, they enable an instant appeal. It is the simplicity and childlikeness of this spring's offerings that commend them to mothers. They have variety also to offer and many pretty details of finish that suggest them to the children. The trend among these finisings is found in "sampler" trimmings. Canvas bands with flowers worked in cross-stitch as they in gay colors like the old-fashioned samplers of a century ago, serve to make belts, bands and tabs that set off many pretty chambray dresses and aprons.

In childish small checks and crosses, they are favored with plain chambray good for collars and other accessories and for trimmings. The plain chambray also provides short bloomers.

The older is reversed in dresses of plain chambray with collars and other accessories of checked or crossbaringham, but the knickers with these dresses are of the plain material also.

For dress-up times there are many pretty colored organdies, trimmed with narrow frills having pleated edges. They are finished with bands of narrow ribbon set on in plain little groups and have slashes of the same narrow ribbon. They are shown in many lively colors, plus green, blue, lavender and yellow, some plain and some with lovely old-fashioned-subtleties to match.

In more substantial dresses, white tape often provides a neat finish, as shown in the frock at the left of the picture. This dress, with knickers, is made of plain chambray, its collar and cuffs bound with tape and rows of tape at the band of plait. The dress at the right, for an older girl, is made of organdy with net undersleeves. A very little needle work on the collar and a ribbon tie finish up a dress that is too simple to need description and too pretty to pass up a notice.

PAPERIE, Tahiti, March 9.—Disparagements of literature about Tahiti and the neighboring islands falsely portrayed them as Utopias of unbridled license and now work is being made in the arrival here of people of little or no resources who, it is predicted, soon will be bothering their respective consuls for help.

Most of the writings about Tahiti are pleasant reading for one who would spend a winter evening by a gas log fire and allow his imagination to ramble on a holiday. It is for these people that the books and articles are written.

But the reader who takes the writings seriously faces disappointment when he spends several hundred dollars to get to a place where, according to the book, a golden brown maiden, possessed of broad acres of rich coconut lands, will entice him to her bosom and fish and look for him while he reclines in the cool shade in silk pajamas.

Men arriving here without funds are in the language of the islands, "on the beach," and must depend upon some chance ship offering them opportunity to "work passage" to some other point, for the Tahitian natives, after 150 years' acquaintance with the white man, has formed an opinion in regard to that majestic being that would not look well in print. The hospitality of the natives has been so abused in the past that now only sound coin buys his favors.

To characterize the islands as "islands of debauchery" is not in accord with the facts. The islands are beautiful and romantic and being in constant communication with the outer world by wireless and ocean are well informed and civilized. The trading companies are thoroughly organized on modern lines and economic conditions offer little opportunity to the outsider.
