## OIL FIELDS OF ARGENTINA MAY LEAD THEM ALL

(By Associated Press)

BUENOS AIRES, May 10.—Experts in oil production say that, as a result of the rich discoveries of oil in the Comodoro Rivadavia field, Argentina may become one of the world's great sources of fuel. Well No. 128, Patagonia, and is more than 600 miles southwest of Buenos Aires. It was discovered in 1907 when a deep test was being made in an effort to locate a water supply. The government, exercising its ownership of mineral rights, set aside 12,500 acres of land in the district and began the work of exploiting the field. Later, another 12,500 acres was reserved.
