SAIZ LEVEE EXPECTED TO STAND THE STRAIN

EL CENTRO, Cal., June 11.—The continued rise of the waters of the Colorado river, which topped the Saiz levee in lower California yesterday, was expected today. Workmen continued the work of checking the flood by piling rock and sand on the levee tops.

YOSEMITE'S NEW IMPROVEMENTS AID MOTORISTS

The 7 a. m. "down" control on the roads leading to the Yosemite national park has been eliminated according to a telephone message from Wallace B. Curtis of Camp Curry received today.

Foster Curry has long advocated this change, according to Curtis. Few, if any, cars ever enter the park on the 7 a. m. control, while scores of motorists find themselves unable to conveniently make the 8 a. m. control up the grade, but are forced to make faster time than they should to arrive at their destination if they have to wait until 8 o'clock to get out of the valley.

The change in the park rules will be of great convenience to motorists. It applies to Big Oak Flat and Wawona roads alike.

Bridge building is going on on quite an extensive scale in the Yosemite valley this year. The firm of Gutcheon Brothers of San Francisco is building a bridge across the Merced river at the famous Happy Isles, and another across Yosemite creek. A contract for a new sewer system for the entire valley has been let to the Schultz Contracting company of San Francisco.

Curtis reports the Big Oak Flat road open and in excellent condition. Travel to the valley is increasing every day and there are big crowds at Camp Curry every week.

94 PERSONS REPORTED DEAD IN FLOOD AREA

PRISONER SAYS HE WAS VICTIM OF CONSPIRACY

TOPEKA, Kan., June 11.—William Cunningham, a prisoner in the federal penitentiary at Leavenworth, today filed a self-prepared petition for release on a writ of habeas corpus in the federal district court here, alleging that he was convicted at Fort Sam Houston, Texas, in December, 1920, on trumped-up charges just as he was about to expose a conspiracy in which officers were involved.

Cunningham claimed in the petition that he had had 22 years' service with his record always marked excellent, and Senator Hiram Johnson, of California, had publicly denounced the alleged conspiracy.

OIL OPERATORS LIKE FISH LAKE DISTRICT

Nevada has wonderful possibilities from an oil production standpoint. This fact was conceded yesterday by E. A. Hitchcock and William Dermody, residents of Los Angeles, who are operating extensively in the Richmond oil fields of southern California.

Messrs. Hitchcock and Dermody, accompanied by their wives, arrived in Tonopah by auto yesterday morning and the two gentlemen were taken to Fish Lake valley by Charles W. Taylor, president of the Fish Lake Merger Oil company. After an inspection of the district, and particularly that section where the Fish Lake company is now sinking a well with the aid of a Standard rig, Mr. Hitchcock gave it as his opinion that the possibilities for oil in Nevada were extremely promising.

Let us forget, it might be mentioned right now that the chances are better than ever that these two well-known oil operators will become interested in Fish Lake valley, all of which means that there will be a stir worth watching as future exploitation of that territory proceeds.

The general formation of Fish Lake valley is conducive to oil," remarked Mr. Hitchcock this morning. "Where one can find shale and fossils such as are so predominant in this region coupled with the lay of the land, there seems very little reason to be offered why oil wells should not be brought in with exploitation consistently presented. I am no geologist, but I have been around all districts long enough to take my chances where the showing is such as is to be found in Fish Lake."
