14 ENGINEERS' LICENSES WERE ISSUED TUESDAY

Fourteen temporary engineers' licenses were issued yesterday by County Clerk L. E. Glass. These licenses will continue in effect until the examination has been held at the courthouse in Tonopah on July 6 and the papers passed upon by the new examining board. This makes a total of 27 licenses that have been issued in Nye county since the inauguration of the strike of miners on April 15.

Under the law passed by the last legislature the state is divided into districts, and provision made for the appointment of a board of examiners in each district. The Nye county board will be composed of Charles Huber, deputy commissioner of mines; Robert Thomas, representing the engineers of this district, and Hamilton Reid, mechanic, who represents the mine operators.

SILVER HILLS MILL STARTS TO CRUSH ORE

A reorganization from Tule Canyon states that the mill at the Silver Hills Nevada Mines company is now operating after several months spent in installing new machinery and overhauling the entire plant to make it conform to the needs of the new process.

The stamps are dropping on a splendid quality of ore, with which the mine are filled and large stoves are being constructed. With the new process, as worked out by Superintendent Charles Wilkinson, after careful experimentation, a high percentage is being gained at a minimum cost for treatment.

As stated in the Magnet after a visit to the property two weeks ago, the operations of mineral at depth have been proven and what was at first worked as a surface proposition is now opened to a point from which stoning may be carried on for years.

There is over a mile of front of the shear-zones of monzonite, which contain the ore, and only a very small portion of the mineral estate is being exposed. The Silver Hills and Silver Hills Extension are without doubt two of the very promising silver properties in Nevada.

COAL RATE BILL MEETS DEFEAT

(By Associated Press) WASHINGTON, D. C., June 29.—Senator Frelinghuysen's bill to authorize the interstate commerce commission to establish season coal rates virtually was defeated, the senate voting 38 to 26 to recommit the measure.

PAPER MILL WORKERS SIGN AGREEMENT

(By Associated Press) NEW YORK, June 29.—An arbitration agreement was signed by union workers at all paper mills in this country and Canada except the International Paper company. The workers had been on strike since May 1.

MOTION TO QUASH INDICTMENTS OF PLAYERS DENIED

(By Associated Press) CHICAGO, June 29.—A motion by the defense in the baseball trials that the indictments charging conspiracy by the Chicago White Sox players to throw the 1919 world's series be quashed, as illegal under Illinois law, was overruled by Judge Friend today. Following the ruling the court adjourned until Tuesday, when both sides will present briefs in the question.

SOCIALISTS TOLD VETERANS READY TO FIGHT AGAIN

(By Associated Press) DETROIT, Mich., June 29.—Fifty delegates to the convention of Disabled American Veterans of the World War invaded the Socialist national convention today and warned the Socialists that the veterans were ready to fight again to defend the flag against sedition, disloyalty and treason.

SEATTLE POLICE SEIZE 1200 QTS. OF BEER IN RAID

(By Associated Press) SEATTLE, Wash., June 29.—Over 1200 quarts of beer and a complete brewing outfit were seized by the police, who raided a house on the edge of the downtown business district here today. The officers said the seizure was the largest beer confiscation in the northwest since the advent of prohibition. No arrests have been made.
