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### A PROGRESSIVE CHURCH MOVE.

The more conservative expression of a second revival of national religious activity is under way and is being followed by the announcement that the non-sectarian organization known as the Protestant Episcopal Church has decided to resort to advertising to promote the organization. It is a general aim to stimulate religious activity by the use of the printed word and the way to make certain that the greatest number will see it is to place it where it cannot be overlooked. The church will use newspapers for its advertising. This proves that the churchmen are in earnest. Everybody reads the daily papers. Everybody reads them because they are available in convenient form. The news of the world and promptly inform people of the great variety of interests which keep our peering population alive and progressive. If people see something in the newspaper they read it with having news value because the editor is careful to exclude mere propaganda from his columns.

Churchmen for long did not comprehend this. It is a good sign that they have experienced a change of view. If they are alert, aggressive and progressive we may expect interest in the church to be justly stimulated. Church advertising is no experiment. But it must be systematically pursued and intelligent if worthwhile results are to be obtained.

### A TRIBUTE TO THE SCHOOL.

To be sure the home and the school for the most part are to be depended upon to train the young boys of the country into citizenship, citizenship which embraces in its practical creed the duty of constant scrupulous lawfulness. There are some other organizations, however, which supplement in a valuable way the efforts of the parents and teachers in teaching the duty of respecting and obeying the laws of the city, state and nation.

A few days ago a New York judge was asked some questions about Boy Scouts. He said: "During my six years as a police judge, I have never had a Boy Scout come before me as a defendant." That is something to think about.

Boy Scouts do not get into court because they do not give in their behavior the occasion for officers to arrest them or people to complain against them. The secret is the spirit of the Scout training, there is discipline; there is education about patriotism; there is inspiration to be manly and brave; there is loyalty taught; loyalty to law and order. The Boy Scout is so busy doing the serviceable, the helpful, the orderly, the lawful thing that he doesn't have time to get into trouble by breaking the ordinances and the laws.

### WHY IS HAY FEVER?

An eastern newspaper suggests that men of medicine turn their attention to hay fever. There is no doubt that a remedy for this distressing and mysterious malady would prove a great blessing for a large number of persons throughout the world. We call it a mysterious malady because it is so. What is its cause and why must its victims suffer annually in spite of all they do to prevent its recurrence? Those upon which it has laid its hold know almost to a day when they will be called upon to again endure its agonies.

Because hay fever is more prevalent in August than in any other month it is popularly supposed that pollen from flowers is the cause. But why pollen from August's flowers and not from those blooming in other months of the year? To answer that the adherents of the pollen theory pick on the golden rod. But hay fever claims its victims in places where there is no golden rod and residents of large cities who never are within miles of that popular wild flower at any time often suffer the most severely. And if pollen is the cause of the disease, why are not all who live in the country afflicted and all who live in the city immune?

The writer who suggested that physicians turn their attention to hay fever may or may not be a sufferer but in any event he puts us to them a puzzle worthy of their fullest consideration. That it is not ordinarily a fatal malady does not

### For the Water and Beaches



SWIMMING suits for children are nearly all of the one-piece variety in knitted wool fabrics that prove the most practical for all summers. They are close fitting and substantial, and therefore convenient and warm, protecting their wearers against chill. For swimming and play in the water there is nothing else so good and they are made in several simple styles that slip on or button at the front or on the shoulders. Two of them are shown in the picture above.

There are suits in other styles and of other materials for children who spend much time on the beach and are occasionally in the water. Red or dark blue flannel is very practical for them and they are sometimes merely a straight, belted short dress, to be worn over trunks, or a waist and bloomers cut in one. White knitted is often used for trimming them, especially for the dark blue suits or sometimes black knitted is chosen for red ones.

There are capes and suits of satine for little girls, made of a substantial quality in this practical fabric and usually in black with a bright color in combination with it. The long capes have simulated hoods in bright red satine and covered buttons also help to brighten them.

Plaid and cross-bar taffeta silks among the fabrics that are chosen for children's beach and bathing suits; this silk dries out quickly and comes up as crisp as ever after a wetting. Usually it takes the form of a straight short dress with narrow belt, some times of patent leather, worn over short wool trunks.

Nearly all hats and caps for bathing are made of rubberized cloth and they are often decorated with flowers or ornaments of the same material. But both taffeta and satine serve for this purpose and pretty caps or hats to match the suits may be made of either of them.
