"TRANSPIRE" AND "OCCUR"

TO OCCUR means to take place, to happen, to come to pass; to transpire means to become known, to escape from secrecy, to be made public. It is quite common, especially in ordinary speech and in writings in newspapers and magazines to hear and see the verb "transpire" used instead of "happen" or "occur"...

SEAGULLS ROUT GRASSHOPPERS NORTH DAKOTA

(By Associated Press)

SALT LAKE CITY, Sept. 23.—Reports from North Dakota that seagulls recently appearing in Midland county had destroyed grasshoppers which threatened to ruin the crops, called attention here to a similar incident in Mormon pioneer life in Utah.

The first pioneers trokked across the plains to Salt Lake valley in 1847. Brigham Young stipulated that there should be intensive cultivation of the land crops were grown and the farmers looked for a bountiful harvest next year. Then armies in huge armies "rained" down upon the crops. The farmers tried to eliminate the pest without success. Transportation at the time was difficult, means to obtain food-stuffs from distant points were limited, and the situation looked critical.

When practically every one had given up hope of saving any part of the crops, the seagulls, termed by old Mormons as "messengers from heaven" appeared. They did not touch the grain but warred on the crickets and in a short time had cut off the fields of the pests. There are reports to show that seagulls also have done this.

DIPLOMATIC PLUMS NOT MUCH DESIRED

ITALY PEEVED NOT PERMITTED TO GIVE MONEY

ROME, Sept. 23.—Much indignation has been aroused in Italy by the proposal that, in determining the expenses of the League of Nations, Italy should be assigned to the second category.

The Italian national pride has been hurt by the suggestion and replies have appeared in the press, protesting against the idea of relegating the country to a position inferior to other great powers. According to the suggestion, Great Britain and France would be placed in the first category with Italy and Japan would occupy the second. The price of being relegated in the first category is 22,000,000 francs a year, while those of the second pay but 10,000,000 francs a year.

RADIUM PROVES EFFECTIVE CURE IN CANCER CASES

NEW YORK, Sept. 23.—Announced by the recent visit to the United States of Marie Curie, the pioneering scientist in this country has made new progress in treating cancer with radium, according to H. H. Moore, chief chemist of the U. S. bureau of mines.

The highly scientific treatment of cancer by the use of radium, known since Mr. Curie's work, is successful only when applied with the greatest skill.

All cancer cannot be so cured, and it requires a skilled operator who thoroughly understands the proper use of radium to get the greatest benefit.
