

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE COMBATING OF VENEREAL DISEASES WITHIN THE TOWN OF TONOPAH, NEVADA, AND PRESCRIBING RULES AND REGULATIONS IN CONNECTION THEREWITH.

Section 1. General Diseases Dangerous to Public Health: Syphilis, Gonorrhoea and Chancroid hereafter designated venereal diseases, are hereby recognized and declared to be contagious, infectious, communicable and dangerous to the public health.

Section 2. Powers and Duties of Health Officer: It is hereby made the duty of the Local Health Officer, and he is hereby directed and empowered:

(a) To make examinations of persons reasonably suspected of having Syphilis in the infectious stages, or Gonorrhoea, or Chancroid, or infection, or the presence of such diseases among prostitutes, pimps, procurers, persons guilty of lewd and lascivious conduct, and persons who associate with prostitutes, all such persons shall be examined within the shortest time possible.

(b) To make an examination once a week of all females employed, or working in and about the restricted districts. Such examinations to be at the expense of such individual examined.

(c) To quarantine, isolate or remove from said restricted district any person infected with any of said diseases, wherever quarantine, isolation or removal is necessary to protect the public health, and no person quarantined, isolated or removed from said restricted district shall be allowed to work in said restricted district until passed upon by the Local Health Officer.

(d) To prevent all females from working in and about said restricted districts until they have been examined by said Local Health Officer.

(e) To file a report each week with the Chief of Police, giving the names of each person examined, provided herein, the date of said examination, and the result thereof.

It is hereby made the duty of the Chief of Police to keep on file in his office a list containing the names of all females examined in and about the restricted district, and to compare said list with the reports filed by the Local Health Officer, and to notify said Health Officer upon the arrival of any female in said district.

Section 3: It shall be unlawful for any female to live in or work within the restricted districts, or to be in and about the restricted districts, for examination by the Local Health Officer, as provided herein.

Section 4: It shall be unlawful for any female to live in or work within the restricted districts, or to be in and about the restricted districts, for examination by the Local Health Officer, as provided herein.

Section 5: Any physician, of every age, and every person who gives treatment for a venereal disease, or is consulted by a person having a venereal disease, or makes a diagnosis of a case of venereal disease, shall immediately notify the Local Health Officer, stating the name, color, marital condition, occupation of said person having said disease, the date and previous date of said disease, and its probable origin or source of infection.

Section 6: That if said person is working in or about said restricted district, then the name of said person shall also be given.

Section 7: Any surgeon or other person who with any drug, compound, specific or preparation of any kind used for, or intended to be used for, the cure of any of said venereal diseases, shall keep a record of names, addresses of the persons making such purchases, a copy of said record shall be mailed each week to the Local Health Officer.

Section 8: It shall be unlawful for any person to neglect or refuse to obey any of the provisions of this Ordinance, and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not more than Five Dollars (\$5.00) or imprisonment in the County Jail for a period not to exceed Six Months, or both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 9: That after the publication of this Ordinance for the week in the Tonopah Daily Bonanza, said Ordinance shall be and become in full force and effect.

HOHENZOLLERNS TO BE EXPELLED BY THE GERMANS

(By Associated Press) BERLIN Oct. 10.—The third year of the German republic has wrought no change of heart among the irreconcilable monarchists whose argument that "the old times were better" is apt to appeal to the people of a large section of the community who are suffering from the attenuated purchasing power of the mark. Some agitation appears in ultra-republican press in favor of banishing all Hohenzollerns from German soil forever, as France did after 1870 with her royal house, in order to consolidate the republic.

OPERATIONS AT BROUGHER ARE SATISFACTORY

The Brougher Divide is one of the busiest places in the Divide district, and the management is bending every energy to get this property in shape that it may be entered among the list of shippers. During the past week the scope of development has been enlarged to a considerable extent, and the showing throughout the workings both on the 185 and 505 levels is most encouraging, and the outlook promises important developments in the near future.

On the 185 level drifting is going ahead on the extension of the Divide Extension vein and there has been a marked improvement during the past few days, and it looks as though a commercial body of ore was close at hand. Two raises also are being carried and there has been an increase in values within the last few feet. On the 505 level crosscut 502 was advanced 26 feet through small vein; drift 518 was driven 28 feet in ore that carries values of from \$10 to \$20 a ton; raise 519 was advanced 16 feet in values varying from \$15 to \$30 a ton.

There is an optimistic feeling prevailing among those directly interested in the development of this property, and it is believed that it will not be a great while now until shipments of mill ore can be started. EFFICIENCY IS WATCHWORD AT MAIN DIVIDE

The scope of development has been enlarged at the holdings of the Tonopah Divide Mining company and during the past week 79 feet of underground work was performed. The physical condition of this property is up to an unusually high standard, and all interested are highly optimistic regarding its future. Work is being rushed on drift 501, where the drift is now nearing the gold zone where rich values were found on and near surface during the early history of operations, and small streaks of ore are being encountered that give values ranging as high as \$70 a ton. No crosscutting of the vein has yet been attempted, as it is the desire of the management to reach further out, holding the belief that a good body of ore shortly will put in its appearance.

During last week the following development was accomplished: Drift 291 was extended 25 feet; drift 311 intermediate east was driven ahead 8 feet; drift 301 was advanced 24 feet; raise 209 was carried 9 feet and the 1100 station was set 11 feet.

During the week the usual tonnage of ore was hoisted from the shaft working; the product being delivered to the tubercular mill at the rate of 50 tons daily. The usual values of approximately \$30 a ton were contained, and a substantial earning naturally is resulting for the treasury of the company. Shaft sinking will shortly be in order again and there is to be no cessation of work in this undertaking until the water level has been reached. This was agreed upon following the decision to construct a modern mill-plant for the treatment of Tonopah Divide ore in particular and ores from other properties generally.

GREAT RESULTS ARE REPORTED AT CALIFORNIA

The showing on the New California mine, which is undergoing systematic development under the management of Frank Stall, gives promise of placing this property in the ranks of the foremost producers of the Tonopah district within the next few months. Development that is being worked between the 300 and 400-foot levels of the mine has exposed a three-foot vein of ore that carries average values of \$40 a ton, and during the past week a force of men has been employed in taking out a 100-ton shipment from this block of ground, and from territory on the 600 level.

One of the best showings in the property is to be found in the Butler workings on the 500 level where three feet of ore is exposed that is worth \$50 a ton on the average. The showing on the Wandering Boy at the 600 level is most encouraging and a high-grade streak of ore is in evidence that will mill better than \$40 a ton.

In the main shaft of the New California at the 1000-foot level the present is being advanced at a good rate of speed and it is hoped to penetrate the vein within the next few days, therefore it need prove no surprise if announcement is made that something of more than passing interest in a mineral way has been found. Excellent grade ore is showing on the vein in a white shaft from the 700 level, and should it come to pass that the ore-shoot is found to be persistent down to the 1000-foot point, then a vast area will be opened for stripping.
