HISTORY MAY REPEAT ITSELF IN TONOPAH, THINKS RENO SCRIBE

These who can hark back to the early days of Tonopah will recall that it was Philadelphia capital that opened the first big development in Tonopah and really started the boom that brought that camp and later Goldfield into the limelight. It was Philadelphia money that backed the Tonopah Mining company, and it was the latter that built the railroad into Tonopah and gave it connection with the outside world, says A. J. Moore in the Reno Journal. During the past week there has been completed a deal that means just as much toward the development of oil in Nevada as did the entry of Philadelphia money into Tonopah in 1902. The incorporation of the Fish Lake Imperial Oil company, with officers made up from the directors of both the Tonopah Mining company and the Tonopah & Goldfield railroad has much more behind it than the mere starting of another oil company. It means that the possibilities of getting oil in Nevada has attracted capital from the old, staid, conservative city of Philadelphia. It proves that some of the best informed mining men in the wide country have been converted to the idea of "oil in Nevada." It carries a conviction that argument could never bring; it carries more weight than a volume of geological reports; it brings with it a standing and publicity that a dozen small companies could not obtain in months; it brings Nevada oil possibilities before Wall street as no other method could. It is well known that the Tonopah Mining company has been spending about \$100,000 yearly out of its \$2,000,000 surplus to find some other source of income when the Tonopah mine plays out, as all mines must in time. They have invested at several points in this country and have tried Canada, Nicaragua, Colorado and other points. This company has at its command the very best geologists in the country. It is only after a long and careful examination of the oil possibilities in Fish Lake valley that the Tonopah Mining management has decided to expend \$100,000 in that valley in search for oil. The incorporation of an oil company and the securing of 2500 acres of land in the Fish Lake valley is

secured and taken to Tonopah and other places. While the merger is the pioneer in point of depth and other activities, credit should also be given to "Nick" Theo of Goldfield. Mr. Theo incorporated the California Excelsior Oil company and not only exhausted the funds of the company, but his own resources as well. It is said that he even went to the extremity of mortgaging his household furniture and pledged his own and his wife's jewels in the vain hope of getting a commercial well before the funds thus raised were exhausted. He did get a showing of oil that was most encouraging, but not to the extent that he could cash in on it. The Richardson & Foster company, which had promoted the first sale of Fallon Oil & Gas company stock, incorporated the Fish Lake Merger, with Charles W. Taylor at the head of it. As Mr. Taylor had made quite a fortune out of a lease in Goldfield, he had a following among his friends in the mining business. This no doubt helped to a large extent, as heretofore the mining men of Nevada have, to say the least, not given much encouragement to oil. Yet the finding of oil in any part of Nevada will do more for the mining business than any other one thing that could happen. Mining men have largely held to the theory that as Nevada was of volcanic origin, oil could not live in its strata. One company withdrew from the Fallon field owing to a report of that effect. Some very prominent mining engineers have denounced the possibilities of finding oil in Nevada in unmistakable terms. Even university men, held to such geology, have joined in the swift chorus of the knuckers and discouraged, if not denounced, the theory of finding oil in commercial quantities in Nevada. There may be many others, but the only two mining engineers to my personal knowledge public expressed their views years ago as favoring the finding of oil in commercial quantities are Ira McFarland and J. K. Turner. Now that the engineers of the Tonopah Mining company and the Tonopah Belmont Development company have passed favorably on the Fish Lake valley there will be a change of attitude on the subject among mining engineers and other business men. HERALDING HALLOWEEN WITH WEIRD DECORATIONS



THE Jolly festival of Halloween is in sight and imaginative people may turn loose their fancies and let them frolic among spooks and fairies. Young people and children enjoy this prankish festival more than any other, except Christmas. In the shops that carry crepe paper and colored papers of other kinds, there are all sorts of funny and gruesome suggestions in the matter of dressing up the house and the table for a Halloween party. They present what their agents have found in the realm where witches, black cats, sprites, ghosts and strange creatures frolic under the autumn moon in the fields where the big yellow pumpkins lie. Having set down their findings in black and yellow and white on paper, they leave it to merry-makers to begin where they leave off and fashion such things as are shown above. Only two light shades of candle shades are pictured, both of them a combination of yellow and black paper with a few touches of black and white water-color paint. One of the shades is a cat's face of orange paper with black ears. The paper is pasted against a cardboard foundation, two faces joined by strips at the sides and supported by ordinary candle-shade holders with wire. In the other shade, a black cat's face is a long board of black crepe paper and has black horns. A yellow whodmill of cardboard surrounded by a fence of heavy black paper stands on a circular cardboard foundation. This is covered with paper grass and hay and two almost leafless trees (of wire wound) with brown tissue paper) appear to be blown by a stiff wind. These trees might be managed with small twigs. Queer creatures inhabit the mill and yard and several pumpkins grin through the fence. These things are cut from paper made for the purpose and printed with Halloween figures. The witch may be cut from paper or made of black and white paper and wire. Her broom is brown tissue paper. A belligerent black cat and an astonished harvest moon are mounted on small sticks for favors. There are many kinds of these, including ghosts made, like the witch, of white paper. Place cards and little holders for almonds or candy are as varied as any hostess could wish—all to be cut from printed paper and pasted to foundations of cardboard. Julie Bottorally
