ALASKAN ROAD NOW NEARS ITS GREAT ENDING

(By Associated Press)
 JUNEAU, Alaska, Nov. 8.—Completion by the end of this year of track laying on the railroad the United States government is building in Alaska was predicted by Governor Scott C. Bone on his return here recently from an inspection trip over a portion of the line. As there are bridges yet to be built, through trains will not be operated for some time. The railroad is to cross the Alaska mountains and connect Seward and Anchorage, on the seacoast, with Nenana and Fairbanks, towns on the territory's interior river system.
 Governor Bone went to the "end of steel" on the southern division of the road and then walked for a distance over the route to be followed. At that time the "end of steel" was at Mile 306 and only 40 miles separated the "ocean end" from the sections of track being laid at the rate of one and one-third miles a day.
 "Unless something unexpected and unforeseen intervenes or weather of unusual severity interferes, the rails will be connected linking coastal Alaska to the interior by the end of the year," the governor said.
 Governor Bone praised the work of the Alaska engineering commission, which is building the road, and its chairman, Col. Frederick Mears.

ARGENTITE IS NOW RECEIVING FAVOR MINERS

Reports from Argentite, the new silver camp out from Silver Peak, are to the effect that development is going forward without interruption on a number of properties and that the showings are all that could be desired. At the Sanger property, recently purchased by Watterson Brothers of Bishop, drifting is in progress both north and south from the 100 level of the shaft. While the vein was found to be somewhat broken up where exposed at the 100-foot point, drifting has resulted in the vein straightening out, and now splendid bodies of ore are exposed in each drift.
 At the Shirley-Edgar property, recently taken over by L. E. Ecklund, representing Bishop capitalists, and which is to be financed in a measure by Sir Arthur Paget, who has gone to England to confer with moneyed interests concerning future operations, there is considerable activity. A 15-horsepower hoist has been delivered on the ground and will be in place within the next couple of days. At that time sinking of the 50-foot shaft will be resumed and there promises to be no cessation of operations until the 200 level has been reached. Drifting at that time will be started with a view to thoroughly exploiting the ground controlled.
 Mr. Ecklund, the moving spirit in this company, is an old-time western miner and has seen years of service, not only in the western part of the United States, but he joined in the rush to the various camps of Alaska, meeting with success in his search for gold. Of late years he has been living on a ranch near Bishop, but upon learning of the possibilities of Argentite he came here, made an investigation of the Shirley-Edgar property, and decided to try his luck again.
