FOOD COSTS ON UPRRAISE IN COAST CITIES

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., Nov. 29.—Cost of food rose in all the larger cities of the Twelfth federal reserve district during the four months ending September 1, 1921. John Perrin, San Francisco, federal reserve district agent, declared in a report made public here yesterday.

"Housing costs also rose slightly except in Seattle, and charges for fuel, light and miscellaneous articles remained practically stationary," the report said. "The costs of clothing and of furniture and furnishings showed marked declines in all cities. Similar trends were observed in the United States as a whole."

IRRIGATORS GATHERING IN MORMON CITY

SALT LAKE CITY, Utah, Nov. 29.—Governors of several western states, together with state engineers and others are expected to attend the convention of the Western States Reclamation association to be held here November 29 and 30. The sessions, it is announced, will be devoted largely to organization and policy. Election of officers for the coming year will take place. Governor D. W. Davis of Idaho is the present president.

Several of the governors expected here, it is said, plan to go to Charleston, South Carolina, to the governors' conference. It is believed that through their attendance at the convention here they will have many matters to bring before the governors in general with a view

to the unified action of states. Following the Charleston conference it is probable that some of the western executives, augmented by members of the Western States Reclamation association and representatives of various commercial clubs will proceed to Washington, D. C. in the interest of legislation embodied in the Smith-McNary bill.
