HUDSON SHAFT SINKING WILL START SHORTLY

There is a hum of activity at the shaft of the Hudson Mining company at Royston, which is to be lowered from the 320-foot level to the 600-foot point. Work on construction of the new hoist and engine building is being hurried and the structure is now under cover.

Delivery of 20-pound rails which are to be substituted in the incline shaft for the lighter ones, permitting the operation of a heavier skip, is now in order, while the new headframe and other equipment will be taken out during the next few days.

It will probably be a week or 19 days before actual sinking is under way, but in the meantime everything is being placed in the best possible condition to permit of the contract being completed within as short a time as possible.

Those interested in the future of Royston will watch developments in the sinking of this shaft with more than passing interest. The proving at depth of commercial ore will go a long way in the upbuilding of the camp. Mining men, as a rule, are convinced that the ore shoots will be found to be persistent, and if such proves true, then Royston will march steadily forward and soon become one of the great mining centers of southern Nevada.

ONE-MAN SUB IS SMALLEST YET DEvised

ROME, Jan. 13.—A miniature submarine having a capacity of about one cubic yard and operated by one man has been invented by an engineer of Trieste to recover treasure from ships lost at sea and now lying in the ocean depths.

The little craft was devised by Francesco Kalia. It has an electric motor, a pump for expelling water and a device for changing the air within the submarine which will allow her to remain submerged for two hours.

Two reflectors of 3000 candle power enable the worker to see clearly about him while immersed. The little submarine is attached by an electric cable to a ship on the surface which can, if necessary, raise the undersea boat. The latter, however, rises to the surface without assistance.

It is claimed that the little craft can descend to greater depths than have yet been attained by submarines. The boat was recently tested by several naval experts.

POLES HAVE RAILROAD TO SEA COAST

Transfer of the Danzig railroads to the Polish government which is to administer the main transportation lines of the free city created by the treaty of Versailles, was accomplished recently without a hitch, this being one of the principal changes in completing the arrangements designed to give the new Polish republic an outlet to the sea. The Danzig railroads are to be under direction of the Polish minister of railroads in Warsaw and operated in conjunction with the Polish state railroad system with an assistant director residing in Danzig. The Poles, it is said, wish to retain all the Germans employed on the Danzig division and in this way do their share toward maintaining friendly relations with the Danzigers so far as the railroads are concerned.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Jan. 13.—Major General William M. Wright, commanding the Ninth corps area, with headquarters in San Francisco has been assigned to command the Philippine department.
