EXCELLENT SHOWING IS REPORTED FROM TONOPAH EXTENSION

Great results are being accomplished on the 1880 level of the Victor shaft of the Tonopah Extension Mining Company. Great bodies of commercial ore are in evidence in a number of places, and the workings are in condition to surrender a heavy tonnage in the future. One of the best showings is to be found on the 1894 east intermediate drift of the Murray vein, where 8 feet of ore is exposed, and while values are not given out by the management, it is safe to state that the product can be mined and milled at a good profit.

The usual tonnage of ore is being consigned to the company milling plant and a high saving of values is being effected. Development for the past week resulted in 234 feet of underground work, of which amount 198 feet was performed at the Victor shaft workings. The official report submitted follows:

1290 Level—1203 crosscut advanced 35 feet in Extension brocca.
1640 Level—Work was continued on the pump station.

1690 Intermediate Level—No. 1 east drift, Merger vein, advanced 16 feet on 4 feet of ore. Stopping is in progress on the Merger vein.
1680 Level—1618 east drift advanced 20 feet on low-grade quartz. Stopping is in progress on Murray, Merger and Denning veins.
1760 Level—1702 west drift, Anchor vein, advanced 23 feet on 4 feet of ore. 1719 east drift advanced 17 feet on low-grade ore. 1719 west drift advanced 4 feet on low-grade ore. 1711 raise advanced 8 feet in West End rhyolite. Stopping is in progress on the Murray and Merger veins.
1880 Level—1804 east (intermediate) drift, Merger vein, hanging-wall branch, advanced 17 feet on 8 feet of ore. 1800 west drift, Merger vein, advanced 14 feet on 4 feet of ore. 1803 west drift, Murray vein, foot-wall branch, advanced 26 feet on a full face of ore. 1808 west drift, Murray vein, hanging-wall branch, advanced 17 feet on a full face of ore. 1805 east drift, Murray vein, middle branch, advanced 30 feet on low-grade quartz. 1804 raise, Anchor vein, foot-wall branch, was continued on 4 feet of ore. Stopping is in progress on the Anchor vein.

There is a total enrollment of 690 pupils in the school. Fourteen new pupils were enrolled in the grades this week and two in high school. The average attendance for last month was 95 per cent. Long themes of two or three thousand words, on various subjects, are due this week in the English III and history IV classes. The final examinations and promotions will be given the week ending February 3. The De Willo Concert company gave a free concert in the gym for the school children last Monday, which was enjoyed by all. During the semester the cooking class of 10 girls have served lunches in groups of two or one guests, the home economics teacher and two members of the class. The problem was to plan and serve a four-course menu for six persons, to estimate the cost, which was not to exceed a total of \$2.50, to prepare a time schedule in order that each course would be ready to serve at the proper time and to make a list of all necessary dishes and silver. Saturday the girls will serve a dinner to the Yerington and Tonopah boys' basketball teams.

SCHOOL NOTES

Work was resumed in the kindergarten this week with the discussion of the new year, what it means and the name of the month. They are taught dramatization and often act out the stories told them. Aside from games and play they are being taught how to use their hands and are now making a real doll house. The girls are making quilts, pillow cases and dresser scarfs while the boys are making chairs, boxes and tables. Their progress is wonderful and anyone wishing to see their work is sincerely invited to attend some morning or afternoon. An increase of 50 per cent in the work of the high sixth has been made since home study was adopted. The eighth grade is an intelligent grade. They are far ahead of where they should be and are now taking up commensuration with such problems as fencing lots, papering rooms and carpeting floors. The seventh grade has been taking an imaginary trip around the western coast of Norway to Hammerfest. The children wrote letters about their trip to their teacher. Many well-written letters were received by her, among which was the following by Lloyd Nye:

Norway, Jan. 10, 1921.
Dear friend:—We are taking a trip along the western coast of Norway. We started from Christiania, the capital, and proceeded northward. The climate of Norway is cold and most of the agriculture is found in the south. The farms are neat and clean looking. They are built on little deltas. We passed through several fjords. They are formed by mountain glaciers. The walls are of granite and some are 100 miles long. We passed through numerous small fishing towns and we visited some of the many small islands along the coast. Huge steep cliffs border the coast in places. We finally arrived at Hammerfest, our destination. This is the land of the Midnight Sun. We managed to get a glimpse of it.
