MUCH INTEREST NOW MANIFEST FISH LAKE OIL

People Responding Liberally to Help Prove Valley as Oil Producing Center.

Within the next few days Fish Lake valley will be the scene of much activity through the efforts of the Fish Lake Merger Oil company in its attempt to prove that oil in commercial quantities exists beneath that section.

There has been a most liberal response among the life of Tonopah during the last week, in a financial way, to assist the Fish Lake Merger company in continuing its well that a gusher may be developed, if possible, and the fact that the company has the most powerful and largest rigging in this state ready to bring into operation again—capable of sinking 5000 feet if necessary—is an assurance that the Fish Lake field will be thoroughly exploited.

Companies at Fallon, Elko, Bishop and other districts of Nevada have received loyal support from their local citizens, in a financial way, the people believing that oil exists some, where underneath the anticline zones. At Elko they subscribed something like \$40,000 to prove the field, yet here in Tonopah, less than 10 per cent of the stockholders of the Fish Lake Merger Oil company are local residents.

The exploitation of the oil resources of Nevada is yet only in its infancy. It is a well known fact that no well has been lowered to a sufficient depth where oil might be expected. The nearest to reaching the goal was at the Syndicate well at Fallon where a rotary drill reached a depth of 2700 feet. The machinery played out at that depth, but had a standard right, such as stands on the ground of the Fish Lake Merger company, been installed, there might have been a different story to tell.

The Fish Lake Merger Oil company has the equipment to prove up Fish Lake valley as a coming oil producing center, which most geologists agree will eventually take place. The company has conservative management, and it looks good to see the residents of Tonopah—the one town most vitally affected—responding in such a liberal manner in the financing of the project which will permit of the well being lowered for 5000 feet, if such a thing is found necessary.

LEAD PROPERTY NOW OPERATED SUCCESSFULLY

The old Downeyville mine, owned by the Goldfield Blue Bell Mining company, is being operated under lease with gratifying results by F. H. Lerchen, Los Angeles mining engineer, and shipments of lead ore are being consigned to the smelter at Salt Lake.

The ore is a galena and carries values of 48 per cent lead and 48 ounces silver, on an average, and a big body of mineral is exposed on the 250 level of the shaft workings. Mr. Lerchen has been prosecuting development for some little time. His advent into the field was unannounced, and following an examination of the property he immediately began operations, with the result that he is now realizing handsomely from the marketing of the product. The output will be steadily increased from time to time and it is hoped to continue regular shipments throughout the summer and fall months.

GREAT BODY OF SPLENDID ORE AT SIMON MINE

It begins to look as though the big Simon silver-lead mine was to be like the little boy's apple, "There ain't nothin' to be no core."

This was exemplified this week when a force of miners put to work breaking down rock with which to use as fill for stopes, unexpectedly broke into a big new body of ore, says Western Miner. The strike was reported to have been made in extending the west drift beyond the faulted zone. The ore body, so far as exposed, is seven feet in width, and is an excellent grade of silver-lead zinc sulphide ore. This discovery is highly important as it adds materially to the already great ore reserves of the mine and the future possibilities in an unexpected section. The flotation plant continues the same splendid performance in production and savings. The transportation of concentrates has slowed down on account of bad road conditions.

This is the second important ore discovery made beyond the west faulted zone and is proving the value of that territory. The first discovery was made across the gulch almost directly under the mill. This ore was almost free of zinc, and some of the samples run as high as 500 ounces in silver.
