## HEAVIER WORK IS PLANNED BY TONOPAH EXT.

Big Pump Station on 1540 Level  
of McKane Shaft Was  
Completed This Week.

### GREAT SUMP TO BE PROVIDED

Ore Showing in Various Levels  
of Victor Shaft Said to  
be Highly Gratifying.

That the Tonopah Extension Mining company is providing for heavier development, which means that within the near future the production from this great property will be augmented in a substantial manner, is best evidenced from the announcement just made that the big pump station on the 1540 level of the McKane shaft has been completed. Work is now in progress under providing a 40,000-gallon sump, as well as providing a station for the transformers.

The Tonopah Extension is prosecuting one of the most aggressive campaigns of mine building that has been attempted in years in the Tonopah district, and it is plain to be seen that the life of the property will extend over a long period of years. Not only is the McKane shaft a busy place, but at the Victor shaft a heavy tonnage of ore is being mined and the reserves are sufficient at the present time to warrant a constant and heavy production being made for a long period. The physical condition of the Tonopah Extension property is reported as being in first class condition throughout the various workings.

The official report covering the seven-day period ending Friday, March 31, follows:

#### McKane Shaft.

"1200 level—1203 crosscut was continued in Extension broelia.

"1540 level—The pump station, 40 by 40 feet by 22 feet high, in the clear, was finished. Work is now in progress on a 40,000-gallon sump, and a station for the transformers which will stop down the current for the pump-motors. Diamond drilling was continued from the face of 1503 crosscut.

#### Victor Shaft.

"1600 intermediate level—The east drift, Merger vein, reached the Extension Fault, and has been stopped. Stopping has now been started above this drift.

"1680 level—Stopping is in progress on Murray and Deming veins.

"1760 level—1701 crosscut was advanced 31 feet in West End rhyolite. Stopping is in progress on Murray, Anchor and Merger veins.

"1880 level—1802 west drift, Anchor vein, advanced 20 feet on 4 feet of ore. 1802 east drift, Anchor vein, advanced 25 feet on 1 foot of ore. 1803 west drift, Murray vein, footwall branch, advanced 18 feet on 3 feet of ore. 1805, west drift, Murray vein, hanging-wall branch, advanced 26 feet on 6 feet of ore. These last two drifts have been temporarily stopped to permit of stopes being cut out. Stopping is in progress on Murray, Anchor and Merger veins.

"Development, 146 feet."

## HEAVY OUTPUT IS MAINTAINED BY WEST END

An Average of Two Thousand  
Tons is Being Produced  
Every Seven Days.

### TWO MILLS IN OPERATION

Earning of Company is Being  
Gradually Increased as  
Development Continues.

The West End Mining company continues to set a fast pace from a tonnage standpoint, and during the week ending Saturday morning, April 1, there was sent to the company mill and to the MacNamara mill a total of 2000 tons. The tonnage and grade of ore was normal. While no figures have been given, it is since arrangements were made with the MacNamara mill for treating the tonnage overflow, it is considered that the net production must have been increased in a substantial way.

The official report of operations for the last seven days, was given out officially this morning, as follows:

"From the West End shaft workings, raise 494 C encountered ore of good grade. Work in the 569 A has been resumed on a face of fair ore. Raise 551 is being driven for a connection with the 400 level for filling purposes. Raise 580 No. 6 made a connection with the stope above on fair grade. Raise 652 B made a connection with the 500 level and will be used for filling purposes. Raise 680 No. 5 made fair progress with no change. Crosscut 683 A made fair progress on low grade ore. Drift 970 advanced the usual distance with no change.

"From the Ohio workings, intermediate drift 510 made fair progress on ore. Drift 536 No. 1 advanced on a good face of ore. Drift 536 No. 2 has been discontinued and drift 542 No. 1 has been started. Drift 549 made fair progress on low grade vein material. Crosscut 614 has been started and drift 577 No. 1 made the usual footage on fair ore. Drift 555 No. 8 made fair progress with no change. On the 800 level, 802 crosscut made good progress with no change to report. Drift 848 No. 1 has been discontinued and stopping operations started. Drift 848 No. 2 made fair progress on a good grade of ore. Raise 871 made the usual progress with no change. There are no changes to report in Tonopah '78" ground, regular work being performed.

"Tonnage and grade of ore was normal with production of 2000 tons for the week."

## FINE SHOWING IS RESULTING GREAT BELMONT

Operations Being Prosecuted  
on Six Levels and Good  
Tonnage Ore Mined.

### MILL IS OPERATING STEADILY

Tonnage Handled Is Being In-  
creased by Shipments from  
Outside District.

The Tonopah Belmont Development company is prosecuting the usual active campaign of development with results that are of a most pleasing nature. Operations are being carried forward on the 800, 900, 1000, 1100, 1200, 1300 and 1400 levels, and good reserves of ore are exposed in the various workings.

The big milling plant is slowly increasing the tonnage handled daily, and it should not be a great while now until the machinery will be running at top speed, in view of the fact that shipments are being received from the Silver Pick in Goldfield, as well as a number of outside properties. The tonnage treated on company account is up to the usual standard.

Development for the week ending Friday, March 31, is reported officially, as follows:

"800 level—Raise 65, off north crosscut 800, prospecting for North vein.

"900 level—West drift 904, off north crosscut 904, miscellaneous vein, prospecting fault. Northwest crosscut 902, off north crosscut 905, mining purposes. North crosscut 906, off west drift 915, prospecting for segment of North vein. Raise 100, off North crosscut 904, prospecting footwall of Belmont vein. Intermediate northwest crosscut, off stope 962, cut South vein, 2 feet milling ore.

"1000 level—West drift 1004, off north crosscut 1003, South vein, 2 feet low grade ore. North crosscut 1007, off east drift 1005, stopped temporarily. Intermediate east drift, off stope 118, Mizpah Fault (A) vein, 1 foot good milling ore.

"1100 level—North crosscut 1109, off southwest crosscut 1145, prospecting in Mizpah trachyte. East drift 1108, off south crosscut 1150, 1108 vein, streak of good ore. Intermediate east drift, off stope 1180.

Rescue vein, 2 1/2 feet low grade ore.  
"1200 level—East drift 1247, off north crosscut 4, Mizpah Fault (C) vein, 1 1/2 feet low grade ore. South crosscut 1216, off northwest crosscut, prospecting stopped temporarily.  
"1300 level—Intermediate southeast crosscut, off east stope 5, prospecting footwall of Belmont vein, crosscutting low grade ore.  
"1400 level—Intermediate north crosscut, off stope 1413, prospecting for 1220 vein."

# IMPORTANT NOTICE

To Secretaries of Corporations Doing Business in  
Nevada But Incorporated in Other States

OUR CHARGE \$9.00

SECTION 1.—All foreign corporations doing business in the State of Nevada shall, not later than the month of March in each year, beginning in the year 1914, publish a statement of their last year's business in some newspaper published in the State of Nevada. If published in a daily newspaper, such statement shall be published for a period of one week, or if published in a semi-weekly or tri-weekly newspaper, for a period of two weeks; or if published in a weekly newspaper for a period of four weeks.

SECTION 2.—The secretary of the company publishing the statement shall file a copy with the assessor of each county of the State of Nevada, in which said company is doing business.

SECTION 4.—Any district attorney in the state is competent to sue to recover the penalty, or the attorney general. The first county suing through its district attorney shall secure the penalty, and if no suit is brought for the penalty by any district the State shall have the right to recover through its attorney-general.

The TONOPAH DAILY BONANZA will make publication required by law, which includes the filing of a sworn affidavit of publication with the assessor of each of the counties of the State, within which the company is doing business; an affidavit of publication will also be furnished secretaries.
