

WEST END NOW FORGING FRONT BIG PRODUCER

Showing Throughout West End and Ohio Shaft Workings Is Reported Excellent.

HEAVY TONNAGE ORE BROKEN

Output Averages Twenty-One Hundred Tons Milling Ore Every Seven Days.

Production from the West End property continues at a lively clip during the week ending Saturday, April 15, a total of 2100 tons was sent to the mills that are treating the product. The fiscal report shows that the property is in splendid condition and that the present production record will be continued for an indefinite period, with prospects bright for the output being augmented from time to time. The official report follows:

West End Shaft.
From the West End shaft workings crosscut 441 has been started for development purposes. Drift 540 has been discontinued and raise 540 started on a full face of ore. A small amount of work was performed in raise 515 A in low grade ore. Drift 569 A made fair progress on a face of good ore. Raise 648 has reached the hanging wall of the vein and has been discontinued. Raise 689 No. 5 has made fair progress with no change. Crosscut 683 A advanced the usual distance with no change. Drift 970 made good progress with no change. Raise 971

has been started from the 967 crosscut.
Ohio Shaft.
From the Ohio shaft workings, intermediate 510 made a small footage on low grade ore. Drift 536 No. 1 has been discontinued and raise 536 No. 1 started. Drift 549 has been discontinued and stopping operations started. Drift 556 No. 8 made fair progress with no change. Crosscut 614 made the usual footage with no change. On the 800 level, 802 crosscut made fair progress with no change, as did the 871 raise. Drift 848 No. 2 has been discontinued and stopping operations started. There are no changes to report in Tonopah "76" ground, regular work being performed.
"Tonnage and grade of ore was normal with production of 2100 tons for the week."

OUTPUT BEING INCREASED IN MANY SECTIONS

Mills of District Treating Heavier Tonnage Than at Any Time in a Long Period.

Conditions generally throughout the Tonopah and Divide districts, as well as in all sections of Nye county, are showing much improvement. The big mines in Tonopah are working at capacity, and the production is being increased from time to time and the summer promises to be one of the busiest seasons that have been witnessed in years.
The mills are handling a tremendous tonnage, and while the MacNamara and West End are operating at capacity, the Belmont and Desert can yet take care of an increased tonnage by reason of the large capacity of their plants. Outside shipments are coming to both mills, and the Belmont is now receiving ores from the Silver Pick mine at Goldfield, and the New Tonopah Dividend and Gold Zone mines in the Divide. Occasional shipments are also being received from the Klondyke section, with the outlook promising for tonnage being increased during the next few weeks.
Work is being resumed on a number of properties in the Tonopah, Divide and outlying sections, and indications generally spell prosperity. It begins to look like Argenteite would shortly be the scene of great activity by reason of the fact that a number of owners of properties are awaiting the arrival of good weather with a view of inaugurating development. The Frances and Ecklund mines will shortly be entered among the list of shippers.



DEVELOPMENT MUCH HEAVIER GREAT BELMONT

Operations Being Prosecuted on Nine Different Levels With Splendid Results.

MILLING TONNAGE INCREASED

Outlook Promising Increased Tonnage Being Received From Outside Properties.

The Tonopah Belmont Development company is gradually enlarging the scope of operations as is evidenced from the fact that development is going forward on nine different levels, starting at the 600 and continuing on down to the 1500. The mine is reported as being in splendid physical condition, and frequently discoveries of more than passing notice are made in the various workings. The mill is running steadily and the tonnage is being increased, not only from the company mine, but through shipments that are received from outside properties, as well as from a number of mines in the immediate vicinity.
The official report of operations covering the week ending Friday, April 14, follows:

North crosscut 9066, off west drift 915, prospecting for faulted segment of North vein. Intermediate north crosscut, off stope 9052, South vein, shows some low grade quartz. Northwest crosscut 9006, off northeast crosscut 928, prospecting in Mizpah trachyte.
"1000 level—Intermediate east drift, off stope 118, Mizpah Fault (A) vein, stopped temporarily. North crosscut 10077, off east drift 10065, prospecting hanging-wall of Rescue vein. "1100 level—Intermediate east drift, off stope 1180, Rescue vein, stopped temporarily. West drift 11008, of south crosscut 1150, 11008

"1200 level—South crosscut 1210, off northwest crosscut, prospecting. East drift 1207, off north crosscut 4, Mizpah Fault (C) vein, 2 feet low grade ore.
"1300 level—Intermediate east drift off intermediate south crosscut, from east stope 5, Belmont vein, 3 feet medium grade ore. Intermediate west drift, off intermediate south crosscut from east stope 5, Belmont vein, 2 feet good milling ore.
"1400 level—Intermediate east drift, off intermediate north crosscut, off stope 1413, 1220 vein, 3 feet good ore. Northeast crosscut 1411, off north crosscut 1408, prospecting for 1220 vein."

HORNSILVER IS SHOWING MANY MINERAL FINDS

Owners of Properties Are Feeling Optimistic and Look for Prosperous Season.

The showing on the Orleans mine at Hornsilver continues to show a steady improvement and those interested in the Orleans Hornsilver Mining company, as well as other companies that have invaded that field, are imbued with a strong feeling of optimism. On the 700 level of the southeast drift a full face of ore is being followed on the Orleans vein that shows average values of \$35 a ton, with about 14 inches that is worth better than \$60 a ton. Work is being prosecuted with vigor in the northwest drift, following a parallel vein and the showing is one of the most promising that has been met up with in some time.
Definite plans concerning the construction of a modern milling plant have not yet been worked out, but it is believed that official announcement concerning this matter will be forthcoming in the very near future.
The Rosetta company is prosecuting systematic development, as well as the Lucky Boy, Silver Dike and a number of other owners of property.

FINE SHOWING IN EVIDENCE TONOPAH EXT.

Great Orebodies Exposed on Various Levels of Victor and McKane Shafts.

BULLION OUTPUT AUGMENTED

Company Preparing for Even More Extensive Output Than Heretofore.

The Tonopah Extension Mining company is making an enviable record from a development and production standpoint, and the mine is showing splendid physical condition. Big bodies of ore are exposed in the many workings of the Victor shaft, largest development being centered on the 1880 level.
The mill is operating steadily and is treating a heavy tonnage of ore and the production is being increased from week to week, as is evidenced from the bullion shipments that are being made semi-monthly. The clean-up of the plates at the mill will be made during the next couple of days and a shipment of bullion made.

OPERATIONS TO BE RESUMED ON BELCHER EXT.

New York Financiers Will Provide Plans for Thorough Development of Property.

The Belcher Extension Divide Mining property will resume work at an early date, and funds will be provided for an extensive campaign of exploration. At a special meeting of the stockholders held at Reno on April 8, 1922, it was voted to increase the capital stock of the company by 1,500,000 shares, making the total capitalization 3,000,000 shares, each share having a par value of 10 cents each. The increased capitalization of 1,500,000 shares will be used for treasury purposes, and thus avoid the necessity of levying assessments.
The stock will be underwritten by New York investment houses and it is understood that the financial end of the proposition will be provided for in a liberal manner. It is expected to put a crew of men to work in a short time, and in view of the fact that the property possesses real merit, the outlook is promising for development of an important nature being announced from time to time.

DIVIDE HAS RESUMED SINKING OF SHAFT

There was no news of importance to report this week from the Tonopah Divide mine, owing to the fact that the greater part of the seven-day period was taken up in repairing the engine which became disabled. This work has now been completed and work of sinking is again under way. As a result of the breakdown the production was hampered for several days, but the usual tonnage will be going out to the Belmont mill from this time forward.
