NOTICE TO DOG OWNERS AND THE PUBLIC IN GENERAL.

Ordinance No. 38, provides: "That the owners of all dogs within the limits of the town of Tonopah be and the same are required to muzzle any dog or dogs in their possession and under their control. That any peace officer or person duly authorized by the board of county commissioners shall kill any dog or dogs running at large within the limits of the town of Tonopah, without a muzzle thereon."

Owing to the prevalence of rabies among dogs the above ordinance will be rigidly enforced on and after this date. Owners who have no muzzles for their dogs must provide same within three days from date, and keep dog confined until muzzle is provided.

CAMPER GROUP AT ROYSTON HAS ORE

A promising mineral find was reported from Royston this morning. The Camper group claim showing a three-foot vein of ore that returns assays averaging \$62 a ton in silver and gold. This property is being operated by Thomas Ross, who holds a bond and lease from John Mihlitch, and a shaft has been sunk to a depth of 12 feet. Values are increasing and the vein is growing stronger and more defined as depth is secured, and the lessee believes he has in the making a coming good producer.

On the Tonopah group, which Mr. Mihlitch has been developing, a three-foot vein of ore is exposed at a depth of 12 feet, which shows average assay values of \$21.40 a ton, while a 10-foot vein shows values of \$19.30 a ton.

Both properties lie to the northwest of the Hudson Mining company's group of claims and are in a highly mineralized section.
