

EUREKA HIGHWAY WILL SOON NEAR ITS COMPLETION

Californians Much Interested in This Piece of Engineering Four Touring Motorists.

REDDING, May 6.—If the present progress of construction is maintained, the Redding-Weaverville-Eureka state highway lateral should be completed this fall, according to information received here.

The new lateral, providing an east and west road for northern California, will open up one of the most scenic and isolated sections of California. Leaving Redding, the road climbs at an easy grade over the heavily timbered mountains into the Weaverville sections of Trinity county, and from there continues down the Trinity river toward the coast. The road leaves the river some distance before it meets the ocean and passes on to Eureka. The highway, when completed, will be the only link between the coast and the Sacramento valley in the far northern part of the state.

Completion of the Winnemucca-Alturas-Redding highway lateral from the east will make the two roads furnish a direct route from the Pacific coast at Eureka to Nevada and eastern points and will, it is believed, soon become one of the principal routes for eastern tourists bound for California.

HEAVY OUTPUT MAINTAINED BY GREAT BELMONT

Bullion Shipment Keeping With That of Past Months and Good Earnings Accrue.

MILL IS OPERATING STEADILY

Summer Season Will Witness Even Greater Activity at This Rich Property.

Tonopah Belmont Development company maintained its lead in metal output during the last half of April. A consignment of bullion that was sent out yesterday consisted of 55 bars, weighing 111,625 ounces and having a value of \$125,625.

PRODUCTION OF WEST END WAS UP TO STANDARD

Output for Last Half of April Came Close to Reaching Hundred Thousand Mark.

PROPERTY SCENE OF ACTIVITY

Weekly Production Averaging Close to Twenty-One Hundred Tons Ore.

West End Consolidated Mining company maintained second place during the last half of April in production of bullion, as is evidenced from the fact that 44 bars were shipped out Friday, weighing \$4,200 ounces and having a value of \$99,358.

Official report of development for the seven-day period ending Saturday morning, May 6, is as follows:

"From the West End shaft workings, crosscut 441 has been suspended and raise 441 started. Crosscut 460 No. 8 has been started to facilitate mining operations. Raise 515 A reached the hanging-wall and has been suspended. Stopping operations have been started from the raise. Crosscut 683 A has been suspended and raise 683 A has been started in the foot-wall of the vein. Crosscut 972 cut a contact and work has been suspended.

"In the Ohio shaft workings, crosscut 536 No. 1 cut the vein and drift 536 No. 3 has been started on the vein. Drift 555 No. 8 has been suspended and raise 555 No. 20 started from 555 drift 8. Crosscut 614 made good headway with no change.

"On the 800 level, crosscut 802 continued to advance with no change. Drift 848 No. 2 made fair headway on a full face of ore. Crosscut 872 made the usual headway with no change. The footage for the week was 193 feet.

"Tonnage and grade was normal with production of 2100 tons for the week."

NAVIGATION OF SEASON OF 1922 AGAIN OPENED

Great Activity is Noticeable at Sault Sainte Marie, Finely Equipped Shipping Port.

(By Associated Press) SAULT STE. MARIE, Mich., May 6.—With the opening of navigation for the 1922 season, this city, at which is located the Soo locks, among the finest and best equipped in the country, has become a scene of great activity. Indications point, shipping men say, to a decided increase in marine activity over that of last year, a dull season due to business depression. Although no such condition is expected as resulted during the war period, when the tonnage passing through the locks broke all records, a decided increase over last season confidently is predicted. The freight tonnage on vessels looking through in 1921 aggregated but 45,259,254 short tons, as against 79,282,496 short tons for the preceding years. The 1921 total was the smallest in more than a decade, the season being described by shipping men generally as the most dull from a business standpoint in the recent history of the lakes.
