## ORDER OF COURT DENIED JURORS' JUST DUES

The people of Nye county were treated during the past week to the spectacle of a jury of twelve good and true citizens being kept under lock and key for a period of six days while a petty trial involving less than \$400 consumed the attention of the court.

Of all the trials and proceedings ever known to a court in this county, the one which was in charge of a jury while a trial was being held in Nye county is probably the most unusual. One would naturally expect that the twelve jurors who were called upon to try the case would be given their just dues and that they would be permitted to go home at the end of each day and night. The members of that jury should receive the same that have been pursued during the past week by court and attorneys, and make known their feelings in no uncertain manner, that such a similar proceeding shall not occur in this county at some future time.

It is all very well in a manner to keep a jury locked up that no attempt may be made to influence their verdict, but when it comes to a silly damages suit involving a few paltry hundred dollars it would seem the court had imposed upon the good nature of the men and women of Nye county in forcing a jury of twelve into retirement for a full period of six days, when they should have been permitted to disband with the recessing of court each night.

The jury in the case in question was made largely of business people and they were compelled to forego the privilege of looking after their private affairs, following the recessing of the court for the day. It is little wonder that citizens are beginning to look upon courts and jury trials as a farce. If the court cannot place a little confidence touching upon the integrity of the juror, why should the juror be expected to have any confidence in the court?

Let it be hoped that we will never again witness such a similar proceeding with any court of record in this state.

Mr. Harding was not actuated by selfish patriotism however. It was not alone these United States that he benefited by standing on one side when the Genoa conference opened. His foresightedness will eventually prove a benefit to the whole world.

With alliances matched against alliances, with secret intrigues matched against secret intrigues, it will be a miracle if this poor old world can escape the danger of a world war.

The one sure sheet anchor to the windward is the aloof position of the United States. In the midst of the hull and the uproar the calm figure stands aside. When every body else has lost his head in the excitement, there will be one cool figure on the side line—Uncle Sam.

It is only the generations to come who will realize the benefit of the deed that the world owes to President Harding for an act of enlightened common sense.

Confidence precedes credit, said Secretary Hughes, addressing the women in Washington. That axiom lies at the root of American objections to some of the elaborate schemes for settling European affairs. They propose something like force in matters which more properly are subjects of persuasion to see the right. This is tacitly a confession of lack of confidence. No consortium can establish credit without regard to the character of its beneficiaries. The United States is detached geographically from alien troubles. We preach honest money because we have earned the right, having restored a depreciated currency by the methods of work that we now recommend. Those who wish credit from us must first give us confidence in their national character. It is some years since our unofficial observer abroad said that Europe looked like a bad commercial risk. It looks no better for reason of anything that has happened since.

"I believe America can show the way to peace," exclaims Lady Astor. She certainly can and, moreover, she has already done so. The Washington conference indicated the way to peace and Europe has but to follow it in her own affairs to put an end to war in the Old World. But Lady Astor had nothing of that sort in her mind when she made the remark. Our fair expatriate would have the United States join the league of nations and send delegates to Genoa; in short, put the money, resources, and men of this country at the disposal of European diplomats. That might or might not be a "way to peace" in Europe, but it certainly is a way that will never be followed by the United States.

The White House was recently picketed by the wives and children of so-called "political prisoners" in an attempt to influence President Harding to grant them a pardon. The president will not be moved by any such demonstration. He and the rest of us remember that those men are in prison because they sought to obstruct the draft or otherwise interfere with war measures. Their offenses were not political in any sense. The indirect harm they caused to thousands of other wives and children was far greater than any annoyance their own families may feel from their imprisonment.

Tests are being made at the big Arlington wireless station for the installation of a radiophone, the messages from which will be heard all over the eastern half of the United States. It is the intention to have presidential messages broadcasted from that point, and the suggestion is made that the debates in congress may likewise be sent through the air. Anything that brings the government at Washington closer to the people is a potent influence for good.

The United States is now importing more than half of the sugar it consumes, and still has hundreds of thousands of acres of land that could produce sugar cane or sugar beets, but doesn't. A republican tariff bill ought to change the percentage of importation somewhat, and still not constitute a prohibitive tariff.
