TONOPAH EXT. SENDS FORTH MUCH BULLION

Sixty-Three Thousand Dollars Was Consignment for First Fifteen Days of May.

MILL IS RUNNING STEADILY

Great Bodies of Good Ore Are Exposed on Lower Level of the Victor Shaft.

The production from the Tonopah Extension Mining company for the first 15 days in May was practically normal although the bullion shipment made today showed a decrease of \$7700 under that of the last half of April.

The mine is showing great form from a physical standpoint and large reserves of ore are showing throughout the various workings of both the McKane and Victor shafts.
