KING ASSUMES BUSINESS ROLE VISITING PARIS

Emperor of Annam Inspects Art Galleries of France Travelling Incognito

Paris, July 12.—(Associated Press by Mail.)—Dressed in a business suit of sober black, a quiet unobtrusive little yellow-skinned man has been a constant visitor recently to the museums of art, painting and sculpture in the French capital.

Few people recognized Phai Dinh, the potentate, emperor of Annam, who adorned in former robes of silk, his hair decorated with gold lace, the red and yellow colors of the dragon of Annam on his breast almost hidden by a large plaque of pure gold set with large diamonds, was seen in the presidential box at Longchamp on the day of the Grand Prix.

A few days ago no one in his mind of him was permitted to stand near the emperor or look him squarely in the eye, yet the innumerable tourists pushed him about and showed him out of the way when he stood too long before a work of art.

One of the first questions Khai Dinh asked after he had been installed in the ministry of colonies, his home while in Paris, was: "Where is there a first class tailor in town?" A representative of a noted Parisian tailoring firm called for the emperor found his clothes too scanty and requested him to return with blue, brown and black samples. The emperor ordered six yards of the more somber patterns.

SWEDISH PROFITEERS ARE GIVEN WARNING

STOCKHOLM, July 11.—(Associated Press by Mail.)—The profits of the Swedish middlemen dealing in necessities, especially food supplies, are menaced as the result of the investigation into living costs by a commission of experts appointed by the Swedish government. The commission sought information on intermediary profits and their influence on living costs with a view to eliminating unnecessary profits, thus cutting down retail prices, and has just issued its report. It makes some drastic recommendations. Official action is expected.

DESERT QUEEN MINER IS SERIOUSLY INJURED

Mike Springer, timberman at the Tonopah Belmont mine and also a member of the rescue team met with injuries to his left foot last night at 6:30 o'clock that will confine him to the Mine Operators' hospital for some time. Mr. Springer was descending the Desert Queen shaft with a load of timbers when the motion of the cage caused one of the timbers to slip so that it jammed the foot, causing a compound fracture of the upper part of the limb.

RACE OF LIARS IS DISCOVERED IN TOGOLAND

Was Formerly German Colonial Possession in West Africa and Quite Prosperous

LONDON, July 12.—(Associated Press by Mail.)—The natives of Togoland are a race of liars, says an official report on that British mandated sphere in Africa which was taken from Germany. The report has just been issued as a "White Paper." Togoland was at one time a German colonial possession in West Africa, and has a population of 900,000.

"The natives have no letters, arts or sciences," says the report. "Consentment of designs is the first element of safety, and as this axiom has been consistently carried out for generations, the native character is strongly marked by duplicity. Eyes in matters of little moment it is rare for them to speak the truth."

"They are unstable of purpose, dominated by impulse, unable to realize the future and restrain present desire, callously indifferent to suffering in others, but profuse in protestation and good intention, afterwards woefully belied by actions."

"The native is attracted irresistibly by noise and uproarious gaiety; he loves music, rhythmic sound and motion, and has a pronounced aversion to silence and solitude, an excessive excitability and utter lack of reserve."

"There are no specific grounds for divorce," continues the report. "The mere disinclination of one of the parties to continue the union being sufficient to warrant its being dissolved. Moral laxness is not unprevalent."
