

GIBRALTAR IS MAKING NOISE LIKE BIG BOOM

Main Property Has Vein of Ore Exposed that Has Width of Twenty Five Feet

The showing on the Gibraltar property, sixty miles east of Tonopah, which is being developed by the New Gibraltar Silver Mining company, is reported as making a splendid improvement and it begins to look like there was in the making one of the coming big mines of the outside sections of Nye county.

The ore vein in the lower tunnel has a width of over 25 feet, with the best exposed that will mill close to \$60 a ton. Small streaks of exceptionally high grade ore are showing and one can pick samples that will carry values reaching into the hundreds of dollars a ton.

The portable compressor has been moved to the lower tunnel and machines drilled were brought into commission the latter part of last week, and as a result good headway will be made in the opening of the ground. At present the working force consists of eight men, but when conditions have been shaped up more men will be given work. Harry C. Sumner is spending the greater part of his time on the ground personally directing the work and all mine men who have inspected the property give it as their opinion that the Gibraltar country is going to make a lot of noise within the next few weeks. Prospectors have increased the district in numbers during the past few weeks and a number of prominent discoveries have been reported.

ARGENTITE IS COMING CAMP SAYS THOMPSON

Goldfield Lawyer Highly Impressed With Showings On Several Properties

J. S. Thompson of Goldfield visited Silver Peak and Argentite Sunday in the interest of his campaign for the judicial nomination. Judge Thompson spent two days at the Argentite camp and reports increasing interest and activity.

The Escondido property, he said, is showing two shifts and appears to be making excellent progress. This is the property sold by James H. Egan and Ernest Shirley to Eke, Lind and his associates, which included also Ralph Paget. He also visited the camp of the Cleary boys, where work is in progress, the Sanger and Tashie property, which is under option to W. W. Watterson, the Bobadilla, and the Inman property, on which leasers have opened a 1,000-foot wide, of which three footings show high grade ore. The leasers intend that this entire ledge if so an easy shipping distance from a mill, would be highly profitable. He also visited the gold prospect located by Neil and S. J. on which Watterson and Taylor are said to be interested. Judge Thompson said the camp shows a lot of work done and the depth of confidence seems to grow as work progresses.

Asked about the real problems of the camp and the condition of the roads, he said that J. M. Chistovich and George Young of Fish Lake valley, who were subscribers to the fund raised by Robert Neil and others for the work which they are doing, visited the camp that week and confirmed their satisfaction with what had been done with the money already subscribed by increasing their own subscriptions to \$100 each. It was understood, he said, that Dave Patterson had done the same thing.
