LET STATE DRY LAW BE REPEALED

It is probable that the next session of congress will make modification of the Volstead prohibition act whereby light wines and beers will be permitted to be manufactured. The movement against the 1919 dry law has been gaining with such momentum that it is generally conceded that the people will demand a change in the Volstead act in view of the uselessness of the statute in its present form which has made criminals out of thousands of law-abiding and law-abiding citizens.

It therefore becomes necessary that the voters of Nevada send to the forthcoming legislative assembly official representatives who will vote for the repeal of the state prohibition law which has been an onerous upon every self-respecting citizen of this state from the very day it was enacted into a law through an initiative petition and taken advantage of as a result of the absence of our Nevada voters overseas and in other localities where they were fighting for their country.

WOMEN'S TAXES REDUCED BY REPUBLICANS

The democratic national committee is circulating the following in a bulletin addressed to democratic women's clubs.

"The republicans claim that the new tax bill passed by the republican congress reduces taxes by \$800,000,000 but whose taxes have been reduced. Not yours, oh, no. No one is more aware of the fact that they no longer pay a tax on phonographs, pianos, and other musical instruments than the women of the household. No one is more aware than the women of the household that the children no longer have to pay a tax on footballs, fishing tackle, baseball and other sporting goods of all kind.
