MANHATTAN IS BEGINNING TO SHOW ACTIVITY

Gold Camp Staging Comeback of Sensational Nature That Promises Big Results

Reports from Manhattan are to the effect that the gold camp of Nye county is thriving and that there is much activity in evidence. The White Caps Mining company is prosecuting a big campaign of development with the result that a heavy production of bullion is being made at the big mill. A force of 60 men is being employed in the mine and mill, and the semi-monthly shipment of gold will be made within the next two or three days, the bullion bar being brought to Tonopah and deposited in the Nevada First National bank of Tonopah, pending shipment to the mint.

The Putney placers will soon be producing and mining operations on a broad scale will be in order about Nov. 1. In the meantime the task of installing the power line that will have a length of nearly two and one-half miles is being rushed to make connection with the Manhattan Round Mountain high tension line. Development of the placer ground has been in order for the last several months, and once actual placering is started it is expected that work can be carried forward without interruption throughout the winter months.

Construction work on the new 20-ton mill for the Manhattan Consolidated company is to be rushed and it is probable that the plant will be ready to begin ore treatment within the next 90 days. It is estimated that the available ore reserves on his property exceed \$1,000,000, and considering that the mill is being planned with a view of equipping it especially for the treatment of ore from the property, it would seem that the company has a bright outlook from a production standpoint.

Leasers are busy in many sections of the camp and many are reported as doing exceptionally well. Owners of property have been busy in carrying forward prospecting work and discoveries of promise are being reported quite frequently.

NATION-WIDE SCHOOL TO PREVENT LOSS

WASHINGTON, Oct. 18.—Widespread instruction in fire prevention methods among the general public is the purpose of the convening here today of the annual three-day meeting of the Railway Fire Prevention Association.

In the year 1921 fire in the United States caused a property loss of \$2,500,000,000, killed nearly 15,000 persons, and injured more than 35,000 others. Of these casualties 82 per cent were suffered by mothers, children and invalids.

These figures are published by the association to show the need of increased campaigns against carelessness where fire is possible. Nearly 90 per cent of these losses of life and property are due to carelessness, and lack of proper education as to existing hazards, according to the association.

The meeting is the culmination of Fire Prevention week, recently designated by President Harding. The campaign of the association this year will be actively supported by various insurance activities and by the United States Chamber of Commerce and many local chambers. Railroad officers and employees have given active co-operation in the observance of Fire Prevention week.

TEA EXPORTS HERE TO SHOW INCREASE

TOKIO, Oct. 18.—Japanese tea exported to the United States since the beginning of the current year amounted to 16,000,000 pounds at the end of August. This increase approximated \$100,000, compared with the returns for the corresponding period last year.
