GREAT STRIKE OF HIGH GRADE AT RANDBURG

Ben Hur Divide Promises to Become One of Substantial Mines of the District

In a telegram received in Tonopah yesterday from Albert Kelly, who is present at Randburg, and addressed to W. D. Shoe, the glad news is furnished that the Ben Hur Divide property, which adjoins the famous Kelly mine, is showing up wonderfully, and that the outlook could be more promising for the making of one of the biggest producers in that mining district. Mr. Kelly's telegram reads:

Arrived from Frisco today and find the Ben Hur vein on the 200 level to be 29 feet in width and showing considerable milling and high grade ore. On the 300 the big vein is 22 feet in width and looks better than the 200. The seven-foot vein on the 300 has the earmarks of a big ore maker. Shipments can begin in the near future.

Tonopah people who hold stock in the Ben Hur Divide company are elated over the word of events, and even brokers and investors in San Francisco feel that the property is destined to take its place shortly among the big producers of the Randburg district. This ore is reported as being almost identical in character with that of the Kelly mine at the same depth, and the formation is such as to lead mining men to believe that the ore shoots will be found to be persistent to as great a depth as the Kelly, which is now surrendering high-grade ore at a depth of 800 feet, and with every prospect that the shoots will still be found to be persistent to much greater depth.

Shares of the Ben Hur Divide company again went soaring on the San Francisco exchange on Thursday, the session closing at 27 1/2. It is believed that the rise in this stock will be rapid and those owning shares in Tonopah continue to "sit tight" feeling confident that they will profit in a substantial manner as a result thereof.
