HANGING OF JOHNNY STEWART.

Johnny Stewart, convicted and sentenced to death for killing Frank Durand at Columbus about a year ago, was hung at Aurora, Nevada, at 2 P. M. on Friday last. Sheriff Helm acting as executioner. The hanging was witnessed by about fifty spectators. The prisoner on leaving his cell stated to the officers that he had but one request to make, namely, that he be allowed a free indulgence in alcoholic beverages until the moment of dissolution. Our informant, who witnessed the execution, states that his request was complied with, the bottleholder standing by him and giving him a drink whenever he desired it. Before ascending the scaffold he gave utterance to the following aphorisms, being evidently under the influence of liquor: "If you take the mountain road you will be murdered by Indians; if you take the trail you will find no water and die of thirst. I must take the trail and in fifteen minutes I will be choked to death." After his eyes had been bandaged and the hangman's noose had been adjusted about his neck, he was asked if he had anything else to say, whereupon, he spoke briefly as follows: "I never knowingly have wronged any man. I love my friends and hate my enemies. I never yet followed up an enemy without overhauling him." Turning to an acquaintance he handed him a half consumed paper of tobacco, saying: "Give this to Larry Murphy of Genoa and tell him that the last man who took a chew from that paper of tobacco was Johnny Stewart." When the moment for the execution to take place arrived the trap-door was let fall and the doomed man was launched into eternity with scarcely a struggle. It is commonly reported that Stewart had murdered two men prior to the killing of Durand. He broke jail a few months after his incarceration at Aurora, but was subsequently recaptured at Elko.—Virginia Enterprise.
