Noes—Babeock, Botsford, Bowmer, Buckingham, Cavanaugh, Gidding, Gray, Griswold, Hawkes, Howard of Storey, Kennedy, McIntosh, Mills, Moore of Eiko, Nichols, Parker, Powers, Rooker, Shakspeare, Shumaker and Tolley—21. Mr. Everett was absent. By this vote the opposition to the bill claim a point has been scored.

The Centennial Commissioners met yesterday and received the report of their Chairman. The Executive Committee were instructed to dispose of all property on hand and report at next meeting. Adjourned to meet on the 15th of February, at which time the report will be made to the Governor.

The papers in Harrington's appeal case have been forwarded to Carson, and if the Supreme Court sustains the District Court then the execution will take place in accordance with the proceedings which obtained in Larkin's case.

Alva Gould's Petition.

In a recent issue we made mention of the fact that Mr. Alva Gould had presented a petition to the Legislature relative to a pension for himself, and that the Judiciary Committee had reported adversely in the matter.

TELEGRAPHIC BRIEFINGS.

Crowds are gathered in Washington to witness the electoral count. Every train brings in new comers, and the hotels and boarding houses are crowded.

Circuit Judge Carpenter has rendered a decision that Chamberlain was not legally inaugurated Governor of South Carolina on the 7th of December, nor was Wade Hampton one week afterwards.

Associate Justices Clifford, Strong, Miller and Field, were in secret session yesterday relative to the choice of the fifth member of the Commission.

The Senate Committee on Florida election affairs have made a report favorable to the Republicans.

Daniel O'Neil, editor of the Pittsburg Daily Dispatch, is dead. John Kain, a New York boy of wealthy parents has been abducted in a manner similar to that of Charley Ross.

Betting men are now offering heavy odds that the election of Hayes will be announced by the Commission. One bet was made to-day of \$500 against \$200.

The American steamship Dakota on her way from New Orleans to Liverpool, was struck by lightning and burned.

The New York Senate has declared its belief in the election of Hayes and Wheeler by a vote of 19 to 12.
