Nothing has been heard of late relative to the Third House. A notice was lately given that a meeting would be held this evening, but the authority for the same we have not yet been able to find.

The sale of the Virginia and Truckee Railroad will take place this morning in Virginia. Trunks, valises, carpet sacks, satchels, packages and other articles of travel will be sold, and perhaps more than one valuable unseen prize may be purchased for a trifling consideration.

The vote in the negative yesterday on the Eureka and Elko county boundary bill was as follows: Edson, Gladding, Grey, Griswold, Moore of Elko, Rooker, Shoemaker and Tolley. Thirty-eight members voted in the affirmative, and in consequence the bill was passed.

According to the report of the Capitol Commissioners for the two years just closed, the expense of beautifying the Capitol grounds was \$18,000, and that for repairing the Capitol building was \$7,000.

Yesterday the first afternoon session of the House was held. The bill under consideration was that one relating to the boundary line of Elko and Eureka counties, and a great deal of interest was manifested in the discussion.

A meeting of the creditors of Kelly & Hofer was held last evening in the District Court room, for the purpose of devising some plan of action to be pursued in regard to this firm.

George Francis Train says that the great men who control the interests of the Comstock go four in hand. Sixteen years ago it was Austin, Lent, Smith and Garrison; eight years afterwards it was Ralston, Sharon, Jones and Haward; five years ago it was Flood, O'Brien, Mackey and Fair, and now Wright, Baldwin, Monroe and Keene are coming in sight.

To-day the first meeting on Saturday of the session will be held, and the final vote on the State Prison bill will be reached.

The question now in the House is as to Mr. Griswold's county. The Mineral Hill strip is now virtually a part and parcel of Eureka, and as it is there the gentleman resides, shall he henceforth be known as the "Geman from Elko or the gentleman from Eureka?"

On account of the water strike made in the Bullion on Thursday evening all work is stopped at present on the 1600 and 1700 foot levels. The water is very hot, and is said to come from the ore vein in the first level named. The water is being pumped out through the Imperial incline.

The Bogardus and Daly match which was to have come off to-day in Carson, is postponed on account of the absence of the principals. They are in San Francisco.

The next Legislative social will be held at the Ormsby House on Monday evening next.

TELEGRAPHIC BREVITIES.

The counting of the electoral vote will continue under the rule that no person besides those who have now the privilege of the floor of the House of Representatives shall be admitted to that portion of the Capitol set apart for the use of the House and its officers, except upon tickets issued by the President of the Senate and Speaker of the House, and tickets issued under this resolution are distributed under the direction of the Committee on Rules of the House.

A labor strike of considerable importance is now in progress in New York. On Thursday six hundred heavers of grain preceded by a band of music marched to the docks at Brooklyn for the purpose of driving off the men who were at work. The police interfered and the crowd was dispersed.

One of the keepers of the Auburn prison while working a squad of convicts was attacked yesterday by one of them and immediately killed. The convict was insane.

There is a complaint made in Washington relative to the way in which the members of the Louisiana Board are treated. It is said that Thompson allows every privilege to Democrats in their visits to the rooms of the Board, but Republicans are denied any favor whatever.

The investigation of the Louisiana election still continues. A delegation of clerks from New Orleans are en route to Washington, and their testimony will be used for the rebuttal of that of Littlefield. The testimony relative to the bribes offered to Wells is believed by some and contradicted by others.

The Electoral Commission are actively engaged in determining the points relative to the Florida returns, and an acceptable conclusion is expected. Justice Bradley will act in the right in the case, although the Democrats seem to question his honesty.

The European war cloud seems to be no darker than before. It is reported that the present tactics of Russia are to keep up the present agitation, which is neither peace nor war. The Russians are not so strong in money and ammunition as they would wish, they have no desire to go to war with Turkey at once, but they wish an indefinite prolongation of the affair.
