### WILL COLSE DOWN

The Commonwealth mine, located near Galena, on the V. & T., will close down tomorrow pending a trip of Manager Clapp to Canada for the purpose of studying the latest methods of zinc reduction. For a long time the Commonwealth has been working in zinc ore in combination with iron and lead, and so far no means have been devised for the saving of the full percentage of the zinc, or enough of it to warrant the waste of what has been lost, and under those conditions it has been thought best by the management to stop work for a time until the desired end can be accomplished.

It has been ascertained, says the Mining and Scientific Press after investigation, that during 1906 as much as \$1,500,000 of ore was stolen from the mines at Goldfield. Of this amount \$250,000 has been recovered and the remainder has hidden or cached awaiting a safe chance of sale to the smelters. 
