**Woman's Party Activities Have
Not Made Many Votes for Cause**

RENO, Oct. 27.—Although not designed to be official or complete, a short report of Mrs. H. H. Clark on her activities over the state in the interests of the Wilson-Pittman Woman's club carried a great deal of encouragement to Democratic women and will have much to do with an enthusiastic showing on their part during the balance of the campaign in Washoe county.

In part Mrs. Clark reported as follows:

"In Battle Mountain, I made a canvass of the Woman's party to see what a following they had there. Didn't find many. I went to their leader. 'Why, I had quite a number,' she said, 'but I am losing them daily. The eastern committee inquired if Sarah Bard Field should talk here and I replied that it wasn't necessary, as she had no following here anyway.'"

"In Carlin Miss Mabel Vernon went to one of the vice presidents of the Civic League and tried to get the women to form a Woman's party in Carlin. No one would join it. In Winnemucca out of 118 women voters I found eight Republicans and four Socialists. In Elko if there were any of the Woman's party I couldn't find them. Since the flag incident no one there will admit she belongs."

"In Ely the first afternoon I called a meeting I only brought out forty-four, but the following day signed up seventy. Anne Martin spoke there and her meeting was largely attended by Democrats who gave her the time of her life. 'What do you think of the child-labor law?' asked one. 'I think there must be a joker in it,' replied Miss Martin. 'How can you treat our Senator Pittman so, who has been your best friend?' asked another. 'I have nothing to say,' replied Miss Martin.

"The Democratic club in Ely has many Republican women, besides the Democrats, who are all the more determined for Democratic victory since Miss Martin's visit. The eight-hour law is the great slogan there as it is in every industrial and railroad town in the state.

"In Tonopah there are seventy members of the Woman's Democratic club who declare they are fighting for principle. At our first meeting there were but few out, but at the second and third there were many more. They became so enthusiastic down there that they went around in automobiles registering women and at that time there were some 400 women who were not registered. The Woman's party slogan down there was that it didn't matter what the women voted for as long as it was against the Democrats.

"There is also a splendid Woman's Democratic club in Goldfield and very enthusiastic women who are working hard for Democratic victory."

**Reno Women Will
March In Parade**

RENO, Oct. 27.—"We Democratic women belong to the first political party in Nevada, and we intend to stay with it in the face of any sort of opposition," said Mrs. F. G. Patrick, chairman of the Wilson-Pittman Woman's club, at a rousing meeting at Washoe County Democratic headquarters Tuesday night. The rooms were packed with women who had come to discuss their participation in the Wilson Day parade and rally to be held in Reno on the night of October 28th.

"It will be a most effective protest against the activities of the so-called Woman's party, if every one of you

women present agree to march in the parade on October 28th, and further agree to use your utmost endeavor to get as many as you can to march with you. The chief reason for your marching is the slogan adopted by our women opponents? of 'Vote Against Wilson,' the very man who has been their friend in all our strife for recognition."

The meeting was addressed by Judge C. H. Burritt, who admonished the women that the parade would start at 7:20 o'clock whether or not there was anyone else there besides Governor Boyle.
