For the past four years the Reno high school has carried away the honors of the athletic contest and has three beautiful silver trophies as the result of the contest. These trophies are presented every year by the Academic Association and have to be won twice before they can be claimed by any school. The Reno team has always trained hard for the events and this probably accounts for its success in the meets. The Elko team last year, under the coaching of Prof. E. E. Catne, a former University athlete record breaker, gave Reno a close run, and although there were only a few men in the team carried away the honors. Carson also put up a game fight and won several places. The Virginia and Gold Hill schools were represented, but only succeeded in winning a few events. The university committee consisting of E. George, A. Boyle and Chester Hart are already at work arranging for the meet and will probably pull it off about the middle of May.

ELY, Nev., May 9.—Active work has begun on the immense smelter which the Nevada Consolidated and the Cumberland Ely companies, controlled by the Guggenheims, are about to construct at Georgetown near Ely. GUGGENHEIMS AND COPPER
Their Utah and Nevada Mines Are Counted on for Big Results

A New York mining engineer familiar with the plans of the Guggenheims in copper, is quoted by a Boston publication as follows:

"The Guggenheims expect within two or three years to control 200,000,000 pounds of copper production or 15 per cent of the world's copper output, and they expect to develop this copper production from the Bingham and the Ely camps, which do not at present cut very much figure in the copper world.

"The Guggenheim group at present consists of three properties as follows: Nevada Consolidated company, Utah Copper company and Cumberland-Ely company.

"These properties the Guggenheim interests control, and they are the only copper properties that do control in the United States. They figure that by 1907 the Utah Copper company will be producing at the rate of 50,000,000 pounds of copper per annum, and the Nevada Consolidated at the rate of 60,000,000 pounds and that by 1908 the production will be as follows:

"The Guggenheims also have large copper interests in Alaska. They are already preparing to build a smelter in that country. "Within a few years I expect the Guggenheims to control at least 25 per cent of the world's copper production, which would make them a greater factor in the copper world than the Amalgamated Copper company now is."

Notice is hereby given that on the 12th day of Sept., 1905, in accordance with Section 23, Chapter XLVI, of the Statutes of 1905, one Philip V. Mighels and Frank L. Wildes of Carson, County of Ormsby and State of Nevada, made application to the State Engineer of Nevada for permission to appropriate the public waters of the State of Nevada. Such application to be made from Ash Canyon creek at points in N E 1/4 of S W 1/4 of section 10 T 15 N R 19 E by means of a dam and headgate and five cubic feet per second is to be conveyed to points in N E 1/4 of S W 1/4 of section 11, T 15 N R 19 E, by means of a flume and pipe and there used to generate electrical power. The construction of said works shall begin before June 1, 1906, and shall be completed on or before June 1, 1907. The water shall be actually applied to a beneficial use on or before June 1, 1908.
